I understand the eighth graders received the reward for collecting the most cans. And then on Friday, just as several Lions had finished sorting food for the Thanksgiving delivery, in came that Box Truck again with another load - this time from DHS. Three service clubs at DHS joined their energies for another big collection. They placed a box in Safeway which was nicely done and I understand, stood at the gate of the football games collecting. What a great idea!

We selected a menu of foods to deliver for Thanksgiving from the canned goods, purchased peanut and jelly for each family as well as the perishables and a turkey. The Goldstein Family delivered their tastefully baked and trimmed pumpkin bread for each family. Rock Hill Orchard donated apples for each family as well.

From beginning to end, the Thanksgiving Project had 44 Lions, family and friends assisting with making it happen, burning about 185 hours and costing us \$ 1,367.00. We served 30 families all with children totaling 140 family members.
