A friend of mine, who works for First National Bank in North Carolina, related this story to me: “First Citizens associates across the country were invited in December to submit stories about the favorite gift they were going to give this season, and the best ones were published on our internal newsletter.

“Some of them were for “things,” one person had managed to get a couple of tickets and accommodations to the next Kentucky Derby for her parents who are avid horse lovers. One associate plans to spend a night at a homeless shelter, working to serve food to the needy.

“One of them, however, wasn't even about a gift the banker was planning to give. That person volunteers at a Christmas tree sales lot which uses the profits to help children with cancer. They have a "burn barrel" on the lot to help folks ward off the cold. Numerous homeless folks from the area will come and warm themselves around that barrel. One of the homeless thanked the folks at the tree sales lot for letting the locals warm themselves around the fire. He then asked the associate what they did with the money they raised. After hearing the answer, the homeless person left only to return a couple of hours later with 80 cents to give to the cause, money he had collected from other homeless.”

The board approved an expenditure of \$175 for the purchase of an advertisement in the 22C night publication.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM.

HOLIDAY GIVING PROJECT

Thirty families consisting of 90 children and 50 adults received a visit from the Christmas Elves via our Lions members, their families and friends. The whole project

was pieced together by 8 weeks of coordinating our efforts into making it successful. Blood Drive Changes

Due to the many, many, many issues we have had with the American Red Cross, we have decided to use a different blood collection group for our next blood drive on Martin Luther King Day on January 17th. This was a decision made after much deliberation and with great anguish. We have had a long-standing relationship with the Red Cross, but we have lost 20% of our donors and it is our duty to change what we can. We used to collect over 100 pints of blood at each drive, and now we barely make 80, and sometimes, not even that. We can't change the Red Cross. We can bring in a different group to collect blood. We have to make it a better experience.

Therefore, with our January drive, we will be working with Inova Blood Services. Inova supplies blood to many hospitals here in Montgomery County as well as other surrounding counties. We will accept walk-in donors as space/time is available to process them. Inova has an appointment system much like the Red Cross. If you are a donor, please register for an appointment as soon as you can. It is my hope that we can get all the allotted appointments filled by the end of the year and that Inova will increase their staff for our drive for that day and we can again top the 100 unit collection. We will have call sheets available at the January meeting (January 4th at

Wesley Grove, 6:45pm) to inform our past donors of the change.

Lion Ken Cook will be working with me to make this an amazing way to start the new year. Let's show Inova how much the people of Damascus want to give!!
