April 12, 2011

The minutes of the March 2011 board meeting were published in the April "Lions Tale". With no exceptions or additions the minutes were approved as published. The club financial report for March 2011 was presented by Lion Tony Barry. The March 2011 financial report for the Damascus Lions Club Foundation was as presented by Lion Mike Thornett. The club and foundation financial reports were approved as presented.
