### **Preschool Vision Screening**

On Dec. 7, the club set up for preschool vision screening at Gladhill Brothers "Meet Mr. and Mrs. Santa" event in their showroom and shop. In all the excitement there were 17

children screened for vision problems. A digital instrument was used to check for refractive errors in each eye and a separate test of the child's stereoscopic vision was performed. These tests can detect conditions that may lead to vision problems in the future. If a problem was detected, it was recommended to the parent that an eye doctor perform further exams.
