Golf Course. Mike presented a plan on how the night would be run and a spreadsheet showing estimated profits. The board voted to have Mike further develop the plan and present it to the board next month.

Youth Night was discussed to follow-up on the discussion last month. King Lion Barbara will handle the presentations at the High School Awards night. The board will ask Lion Cheryl to attending the meeting next month to discuss Youth Night and her needs for help.
