**Board of Directors Meeting Minutes**  
**21 Jun 2016**

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 pm by King Lion (KL) Barbara Barry.

The minutes of the May meeting were approved. Thank yous were received from Damascus Elementary School, Clarksburg Helping Hands 4-H, and Michael Manfredi in response to funds distributed at Youth Night.

**Club Treasurer Report:** Approved.

**Foundation Treasurer Report:** Approved.

**Treasury Summary:**

Budgets for both the Club and the Foundation were approved. The club budget has a net gain of \$81 and the Foundation with a net loss of \$6505. Lion Mary Frances noted that the District approved a \$.50 increase in dues and that will reduce our club gain without an increase in the club dues charged to members.

Payments in support of program speakers this year were approved as follows: Operation 2nd Chance, 200; Damascus Volunteer Fire Dept., 200 Chesapeake Bay Foundation, 200, 4-H, 50. Additional support approved for: Special Olympics, \$250; Damascus Heritage Society, \$250.

We have received a request for a nomination from the Visiting Angels for a person worthy of community recognition. The presentations will be made on July 8th at the Gaithersburg Holiday Inn. Lion Julie Sain will handle our nomination.

**Past month activities:** KL Barbara attended the Memorial Day service at the American Legion and marched in the National Memorial Day parade. We provided hearing and vision screenings with the MHU from the District at the Damascus Relay for Life; Lion Chris Fletcher assisted with the event for the duration.

We will get a block of 100 Keys tickets for the July 21st game. They will be available for sale at the flea

market and the pancake breakfast during Celebrate Damascus.

Upcoming activities: Celebrate Damascus parade is on Friday, July 8th, and the pancake breakfast is on Saturday, July 9th from 7 - 10am.

One final expenditure was approved to pay for the repairs to the large capacity coffee pot at Damascus United Methodist Church. Our interest in the repair was to provide adequate coffee for the pancake breakfast. Making one 10-cup pot at a time is onerous. Lion Joy had paid for the repair and we will reimburse her in the amount of \$397.40.

The meeting adjourned at 8:16pm.

**Report from the Sight Conservation Committee**

For the 2015-2016 year, your Damascus Lions Club provided financial assistance to seven Damascus and Clarksburg citizens so that they could receive eye examinations and/or purchase glasses. Two individuals are still awaiting their glasses. The other five were assisted at a total cost to our club of \$642.18.

We help needy citizens obtain eye appointments and glasses if they reside in the Damascus/Clarksburg area and they can explain why they need financial assistance from our club. Individuals from outside our Damascus/Clarksburg area are referred to other Lions clubs. Our club helps in three ways:

1) if the individual receives Medicaid and does not have a current eyewear prescription, we refer him/her for an eye examination with an optometrist that accepts Medicaid. Medicaid pays for the appointment. Then, with the new prescription, we send him/her to Eyeballs in Damascus to be fitted for glasses. Eyeballs bills the Lions Club directly for the glasses.

2) if the individual does not receive Medicaid and does not have a current eyewear prescription, we refer the individual to Mt. Airy Eyecare Center for both an eye examination and glasses. Mt. Airy Eyecare bills the club directly.

3) if the individual has a current prescription and just needs glasses, we refer him/her to Eyeballs. Eyeballs bills the club directly.

Mt. Airy Eyecare Center and Eyeballs provide our club with reduced pricing. For eyewear, they often just charge us for the costs they incur from their suppliers.

### **Road Clean-up**
