Pancake Breakfast- March 16

Years ago and in the beginning, Pancake Day was a day long event, from breakfast time to dinner time -7 am to 7 pm. Served pancakes and sausage and beverages. Our memories take us back to the early 1950's. The first breakfast was held at the Damascus Chevrolet garage service area before the garage was completely built. Not sure of the setup other than it was in the service area and the driveway was not paved. It was muddy, cars got stuck and mud was being trapped into the breakfast area. Must have used gas griddles. Do not know about the tables and seating arrangements. Yet it was a success! And some 75 years later, we are keeping the tradition – a Damascus Lions Pancake Breakfast.

Yes, you would have thought we were part of Hell's Kitchen with Chef Ramsey! "The ovens are not getting hot! Heat the gravy on the stove top! The Convention Oven is slow! Cook some sausage on the stove top! We need eggs! We need pancakes. How about potatoes, are they ready? We are out of onions! Used the last of the eggs and we have another hour to go! We are out of orange juice! Did you take the temperature of that sausage?" Yes, we made a grocery run to get eggs and OJ!

- The morning started very slow but about 8:30, we became a popular place to gather! The dining room had a good crowd for about 2 hours. The bake table was laden with baked goodies and kiddie treats. The Leos, Leo Advisor Lion Kim and daughter were a great help in the dining room. Lions who had not worked the breakfast previously, came to the rescue and did a great job from beginning thru the cleanup! Thanks to the two Certified Kitchen Managers from DUMChurch for their time and help both days!
- There was very little food leftover Oh maybe a couple pounds of butter! And a little bit of coffee!

- Our records reflected that 229 tickets were turned in but in reality, there was more diners than that! The Bake Table brought in donations totaling \$537. Had some generous donors scarfing up the baked goods! I The donation jars on the tables brought in \$75. The overall profit for the breakfast is a whopping \$ 3,778.61. A record!
- Damascus Lions has many tremendous willing members – We cooked and set up on Friday! Saturday, we put it into action. We had every angle covered and did it well. We have heard many compliments from the diners – and that says it all! Thanks to Damascus Lions for having and cooking another great Pancake Breakfast. Thank You to our fellow Damascus Lions! Lion Bob Newlin Golden Anniversary in Lions

Lion Bob Newlin is best known for his role as the "Bum" roaming the streets of Damascus looking for persons to become new members of the "Damascus Liars Club." His recruiting efforts included a free breakfast at "Tom & Rays" where the "Bum" would convince his prospects to join the "Liar's Club." Bob's method of meeting with small groups of prospective members at breakfast got the attention of Past International President (PIP) Clem Kusiak when an article about Bob appeared in the Lions Club International (LCI) magazine "Lion." PIP Kusiak always comments on Bob's method of recruiting new members when PIP Kusiak visits the Damascus Lions Club. Lion Bob sponsored thirty-three members for induction into the Damascus Lions Club. The newest Lion sponsored by Lion Bob is his wife Lion Colleen. Lion Bob sponsored eight current members of the club.

Lion Bob joined the Damascus Lions Club in February 1971 and was an active Lion until January 1980, when the Department of Energy transferred him to Washington State. Lion Bob returned to the Damascus Lions Club in January 1983 and has been an active member since returning. Bob was King Lion during 1990-1991 and has contributed to numerous committees. When Lion Bob was chair of the Holiday Basket Project, he convinced his co-workers at the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to start an annual food drive for the benefit of the Damascus Holiday Basket Project. The NRC supported the Holiday Basket Project through December 2022 even though Bob retired from NRC in 1996.

Lion Bob has been an active member of the Damascus Lions Club for 50 years. The Damascus Lions Club recognized Bob as Lion of the Year and Lion of the Years. He also received the Hyatt Award and the Emerson Slacum Award. Bob became a Melvin Jones Fellow in 2005 and was awarded a Life Membership by LCl in 2021. Please congratulate Lion Bob on his achievements.
