We purchased an outfit for each of the children, 2 bath towels for each family as well as Gift Cards for the teens. Each family will receive a gift card for perishable foods.

Lion Ray Molesworth has coordinated the Food Drives with the area schools for non-perishable foods.

We will have Signup sheets available again at the December 3rd Dinner Meeting for Delivery Teams, sorting good on Wednesday, December 18, as well as prep jobs on the 19th and 20th.

We need YOU! We will have fellow Lions to pack food for Teams that are not available to pack. Please let Lion Mary Frances know if you are unable to pack your food! A large vehicle or truck is helpful for Delivery Teams. Teams will be assigned 3 – 4 families for delivery. Teams will have 2-3 food boxes, bag of toys and another bag of clothes and gifts. Tradesmen Motorcycle members will be on site Saturday morning, the 21st, to help with loading and delivering. This is a great opportunity to express to them our gratitude for partnering with us!

The Project will take place at Gladhill Tractor, Route 27 and 80.

Our Schedule to put the project together is – December 18 6:30 pm - Sorting the canned foods at Gladhill Tractor.

December 19 - 20 –Noon to 5 pm. Teams pack food boxes for families. Gifts and Toys will be packed as well. We can use help with a variety of chores. December 21 8:45 AM – Teams deliver the food and gifts to their families. Teams will congregate around 7:30 for coffee and buns!


