Each family will receive a generous box of canned and packaged goods. The Lions will deliver all excess food to the Damascus Help food closet.

During November, John T. Baker Middle School Student Government (SGA) sponsored the food collection at Baker MS under the supervision of Angela Blankenship, SGA Sponsor. Lion Rob Hyman, and the Damascus High School Leo Club lead the food collection effort at Damascus High School.

Damascus Lions Club offers two different scholarships to the Damascus/Clarksburg School Cluster.

The Simpson Scholarship is based on Community Service and Leadership and is for a full time student.

We offer 3 Scholarships in the amount of \$2,000 each to be used toward tuition.

The Michael J. Thornett Unique Achievement Scholarship is based on a student who has overcome a circumstance or situation to get to graduation. We offer 3 scholarships in the amount of \$1,500 and can be used for books, tuition or other related college expenses.

The receive/due date for the applications is April 10. The criteria and applications are the Damascus Lions web site and in the CHS and DHS Career Centers. The Scholarship Recipients will be announced at the High School's Award Night and at the Damascus Lions Youth Night.
