Eyeglass & Hearing Aid Collection

The Damascus Lions have typically collected over a thousand pairs of used eyeglasses each year. Last year we collected and delivered to LCOF (Lions Community Outreach Foundation of District 22-C) 2,507 pairs of glasses and 20 hearing aids. So far this year we have provided 600 sorted and packaged ready for shipping

to LCOF plus another 143 to a Rockville sorting and packing activity. LCOF then sends these glasses to a distribution center in Mexico where they are calibrated and provided to those in need.
