Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

April 13, 2010

King Lion Mary Frances Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM. In attendance were Lions Mary Frances Gosnell, Ken Phillips, Charlie Stone, Mike Thornett, Tony Barry, Marcia Holpuch, Barbara Barry, Tom Jackson, Martin Carr, Tess Gladhill, Bill Mahylis, Warren Schwab and Joy Schwab.

The minutes of the March board meeting were published in the April Lions Tale. With no corrections or additions, the minutes were approved as published.

The club financial report for March was presented by Lion Tony Barry. The report showed a net income of over \$1823. This activity was primarily due to the club auction and payment of meals. The year-to-date data show a deficit of approximately \$1568. During discussions of the report it was pointed out that we will be losing approximately \$1500 on meals this year with the guarantee to the church and low attendance at the meetings. King Lion elect Marcia will study billing options for next year and present them to the board next month. The reports were approved as presented.

The foundation financial reports were given by Lion Mike Thornett. March showed an income of \$3981 and expenses of \$1707 were reported. To-date figures show the foundation has a deficit of \$702. The report was approved as presented.

The in-house auction committee reported that the auction went over budget this year and that all buyers paid their bill before leaving the meeting. A great job this year.

The pancake breakfast committee reported another successful breakfast. There was some discussion of holding just one breakfast next year since the fall breakfast seems to not be as popular. The committee will report back to the board later.

The membership committee reported that with the new members recently installed our membership is at 92. That is down 2 from last year but three losses were due to death and do not count against our count for the District. District records will show a gain of one.

The Big Band Dance has struggled above the break-even point. Even though it will not make much money for the club, it will be a community activity that a lot of people look forward to and is worthwhile.

The club will have 12 members attending 22-C night to celebrate DG Bill Thomas' successful year for District 22-C.

May 4th will be Youth Night for the club to honor the youth of the community. Lion Ray Molesworth will not be

able to direct that meeting and King Lion Mary Frances is taking over. She may be calling on others to help out.

Relay for Life events will be held at the Fire Department Activities Center on May 8th and at Clarksburg High School on May 22nd. The Clarksburg LEO club will be forming a team to walk at Clarksburg. The board approved \$200.00 to be spent for snacks and water to be passed out by the Club and Branch during these events.

White Cane will be held in May and membership brochures will be provided in the buckets to be given to anyone who expresses an interest in the Lion Club.

May 18th will be LEO officer installation night for our 4 active LEO clubs. Certificates will be provided to the incoming officers.

The Celebrate Damascus committee has been working to plan that event for July 9th and 10th. Lion Tess Gladhill reported that there are no issues at the present time. Funding for the fireworks display is the primary focus. Fund raisers will be held and donations will be requested. The board approved a donation of \$500.00 to be forwarded to the Fire Department for firework fund. The club will have an information booth and a flea market booth for anyone that wants to donate items to be sold in the booth.

The community Fair will be held Sept 10,11 and 12. The club will have an information booth and will provided free popcorn to the patrons of the fair. The Board approved \$500.00 for popcorn supplies and an ad in the Fair booklet.

The scholarship committee has 8 applications and is evaluating them. One application was from a student who does not attend either Damascus or Clarksburg, however the student does live in the area. Since the announcement in the Gazette did not include a restriction to students in those schools, the board approved the committee to consider this application. The committee was approved to consider up to 5 scholarships for next year.

At no cost to the club, we will be sponsoring an exchange student on a trip to Hungary. A student from the National Cathedral School has the financial support needed for the trip but was in need of a sponsoring organization. Lion Marcia volunteered our club. There is going to be an attempt to connect the student with a Lions Club in Hungary and some pins and/or banners will be supplied for exchange. The student will report back to our club on the trip.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:04.
