This year we spent over \$1500 on eye exams, buying glasses and the magnification system.

Board of Directors Meeting Minutes May 11, 2010

King Lion Mary Frances Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM. In attendance were Lions Mary Frances Gosnell, Ken Phillips, Charlie Stone, Tony Barry, Marcia Holpuch, Barbara Barry, Tom Jackson, Tess Gladhill, Bill Mahylis, Warren Schwab and Joy Schwab.

The minutes of the April board meeting were published in the May Lions Tale. With no corrections or additions, the minutes were approved as published.

The club financial report for March was presented by Lion Tony Barry. The report showed a net loss of about \$890. This activity was primarily due to the club dues and meals. The year-to-date data show a deficit of about \$1741. The reports were approved as presented.

The foundation financial reports were presented by Lion Tony Barry in the absence of Lion Mike Thornett. March showed an income of \$4419 and expenses of \$4677 were reported. To-date figures show the foundation has a deficit of \$1960. The report was approved as presented.

King Lion Mary Frances reported on plans to meet and greet the riders in the Cycling for Sight event. They will be passing through Damascus and we will meet them at the Park and Ride on the corner of Rt. 108 and Rt. 124.

The membership committee reported work on plans for next year to continue aggressive recruiting efforts and ask the membership to help. It was also reported that Lion Tim Dissmeyer requested resignation from the club. That request was approved and Lion Tim will be dropped in good standing on the June membership report.

The board discussed the proposal of forming a foundation in the District to honor PID Gaffigan that is to be voted on at the convention. The board felt that the District does not need another foundation and unless there is some convincing information presented at the convention recommended that the delegates vote no.

King Lion reported that the club picnic would be held at Wesley Grove UMC on June 1st. The cost will be \$12.00 and each member is asked to bring a covered dish to share. In addition, King Lion is asking for "talented" members to step-up and participate in the entertainment for the evening.

Many thank you notes have been received from the youth organizations honored on Youth Night.

White Cane was successful with the collection of \$1428 despite several shifts were open during the campaign.

The Celebrate Damascus committee is continuing work on plans for that event on July 9th and 10th. Lion Tess Gladhill reported that everything is going well. Funding for the fireworks display was realized from the bingo. The biggest concern is safety during the parade with such big crowds and the many kids in the streets.

The community Fair will be held Sept 10, 11 and 12. The Board approved funding for prize money for the coloring contest at the Fair.

Lion Mary Frances reported that Basket Bingo is planned for October 8, 2011 at the Activities Building.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:29.
