Cycling for Sight

The cyclists rode into Damascus Saturday, June 19 meeting up with their cause to ride - Lion Aquilla Harris, who has arrived ahead of the cyclist accompanied by Lion Donna Starkweather. Lion Aquilla had two eye surgeries a year ago in May and is preparing to go back to Michigan for two or three more procedures. Lion Aquilla was blind in one eye and the sight in the other eye was fading very swiftly. Since the surgery, she has been able to see out of both eyes only she sees double everything. With the next few procedures she is hoping to gain 20/20 vision. She needs funds for transportation to Michigan and for lodging while she is there as the procedures are out-patient ones.

Thus the reason the cyclists, who are members of the Maryland Cycling for Sight Lions Club, Inc., were taking a 50 mile ride. They started at Sandy Spring Sherwood High School; proceeded to Damascus and then traveling to Laytonsville and back to Sherwood High School. The day was a bit muggy and warm but the cyclists were prepared. There were 7 of them, two of whom were riding a bicycle built-for-two. The Maryland Cycling for Sight Lions Club do fund raisers to assist those with sight problems. Their Lions meetings on held online. Their members are from Aberdeen to Cecilton to Alexandria to Laytonsville.

Six Damascus Lions greeted the cyclist as they came into town on Route 108 with signs welcoming them as well as having water, fruit and snacks for them. We gathered around the gazebo at the Park N Ride. King Lion presented Lion Mike Layman, President of the Cycling Club, with a check for \$100 to be used for the Lion Aquilla Harris Fund.

Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

June 8, 2010

King Lion Mary Frances Gosnell called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM. In attendance were Lions Mary Frances Gosnell, Ken Phillips, Charlie Stone, Tony Barry, Marcia Holpuch, Barbara Barry, Tom Jackson, Ray Molesworth, Tess Gladhill, Bill Mahylis, Martin Carr, Warren Schwab and Joy Schwab.

The minutes of the May board meeting were published in the June Lions Tale. With no corrections or additions, the minutes were approved as published.

The club financial report for May was presented by Lion Tony Barry. The report showed a net loss of about \$2265. This activity was primarily due to the club dues and meals. The year-to-date data show a deficit of approximately \$359. Current bank balance of \$5162.41 was reported. The reports were approved as presented.

The foundation financial reports were presented by Lion Tony Barry in the absence of Lion Mike Thornett. May showed an income of \$1605 and expenses of \$5293 were reported. To-date figures show the foundation has a deficit of \$6044; however the golf tournament results have not been reported. The report was approved as presented.

King Lion reported that the club has received the 5-Star award for the Lion Year 2009-2010. In addition, 7 of the 9 special awards were earned for the year.

Secretary Ken Phillips reported that Ron Brouillard has not paid his dues for the second half of the year. The board approved a letter to Lion Ron giving him until June 26 to respond or be dropped from membership.

King Lion Mary Frances reported on plans to meet and greet the riders in the Cycling for Sight event. They will be passing through Damascus and we will meet them at the Park and Ride on the corner of Rt. 108 and Rt. 124.

The membership committee reported that Lions Renee Mason, Lauren McCormick, and Cathy Haver would be dropped from membership. They have served as LEO advisors for the past several years. The new members inducted in May will replace them as LEO advisors. In addition, Lion Leslee Poole will convert to a regular member after stepping down as a LEO advisor.

King Lion Mary Frances has contacted the Laytonsville Club and the Monocacy Club to see if they would like to take over the sponsorship of the LEO Club at Martin Luther King Middle School. If there is no response

the charter of that club will be turned in. It has not functioned during the past year.

The board responded to a donation request from the Children's Inn of NIH by approving a donation of \$100.00.

Some additional thank you notes have been received from the youth organizations honored on Youth Night.

The Celebrate Damascus committee is continuing work on plans for that event on July 9th and 10th. Lion Tess Gladhill reported that flea market requests are coming in. The Club will have a booth to sell items contributed by the members. Bring in those things you forgot at the auction and, if they don't sell, they will be kept for next year's auction. Lion Tess will be looking for help to setup on Friday and to work the flea market on Sat.

Relay for Life was reported to be a success. Lions Jerry Mallack, Bernie Duplan and Mary Frances Gosnell worked the Damascus event. Lions Dale Ryan and Chris Fletcher handled the event in Clarksburg.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40.

Meetings and Meals

The best way to know what's going on with the club is by regularly attending the meetings. It's great to see as many club members as are able to attend meetings.

You may or may not know that we have a guaranteed minimum number for our dinner meetings. This means that as a club, we must pay for 50 meals no matter what. When meeting attendance is below 50, the club still has to pay.

We are very fortunate to have the great meals we get at Wesley Grove at a reasonable cost. Most clubs are not as lucky. We would like to continue our arrangement with the church and stop excess club expenses.

After careful consideration, the board has passed the following meal policy. Meals paid at the door will increase to \$15 per person. You may choose to prepay your meals with your dues for 6 months at a time and take advantage of a discounted rate of \$12 per meal. Prepaid meals cannot be transferred. Charter night and Installation night will continue to be paid separately since the price varies by location. If you regularly attend meetings, taking advantage of the prepaid discount will save you money.
