Treasurer Reports were given by Lion Tony Barry, Club Report and Lion Mike Thornett, Foundation Report. The reports were approved as presented.

Correspondence included request Damascus Heritage Society Golf Tourney requesting a donation. It was approved to send \$50 to sponsor Goodie Bags; had a request for a \$25 for the Coloring contest at the Community Fair. This is a budgeted item.

Announcements – A former Lion Roger Buxton died and the club has been requested to have a Memorial Service. The members will adjourn the Board Meeting in time to do the Service at 8:15 at Montgomery UM Church tonight.

Committee Reports

At the Zone Meeting, it was decided that the area Lions Club do an extra White Cane or fund raiser to raise money for eye glass requests in the Gaithersburg area. The Board approved a \$300 donation to be sent to Montgomery Central-Derwood Lions who are the coordinator for the Zone.

Suggested we send the \$600 budgeted to Lions Camp Merrick.

READ THIS!! [Scam Alert]

This could be the most important article you read! When this first happened to us, I was surprised, but now I have learned about others and feel absolutely compelled to pass on this warning to you. You are a kind, compassionate person and would want to do what you could to help. That, my friend, is the weakness they prey on. Our story goes like this...

Charlie & I have been married for over 30 years. I had never met his Great Aunt Gladys and he hadn't seen her since before we got married. She lives in Illinois, not far from where we grew up. While visiting over the holidays, we stopped to see his cousin and she suggested we go visit her mom. We had a wonderful afternoon chatting and sharing stories with a sharp, articulate 92 year old delight. It was certainly one of the highlights of our trip. A couple of weeks later, I got a call from Charlie's cousin asking where Charlie was. "Well, he's at work, or at least he should be," I replied. "Why do you ask?" His cousin then went on to explain that his mom had gotten a call from a fellow claiming to be Charlie and needed \$2,500 to post bail to get out of jail in Chicago, and could she help out? Fortunately, cousin Nick walked in while Aunt Gladys was on the phone and the fellow hung up when Nick got on the line. Of course, Aunt Gladys wanted to help. She's that kind of nice lady. And she made Nick call to make sure Charlie was okay. This time, Charlie was not in jail. The whole incident took us by surprise as Charlie and Aunt Gladys do not share a last name and we had no information on our phones, or in email about her. We were truly perplexed how someone could have made such a connection between them.

Since then, I have heard of 2 others that have gotten calls like this. One from our very own "Mom Hardy," mother of Lion Mary Frances. Like Aunt Gladys, she got a call from a young man claiming to be her great-grandson and needing some money to help him out of a situation. Quite timely, Lion Mary Frances happened to arrive just in time to prevent Mom Hardy from sharing her fortune.

My warning is this... Your dear nephew, grandson, great-grandson, may get in trouble from time to time. And you may, in fact, be called upon to help out in a time of need, but if your phone rings and everything is "urgent" and needs to be done "right away," don't play that game! Your next phone call should NOT be to your bank! Make a different phone call to verify the story, call another family member, find out if it's real. The caller may urge you to "not tell my parents," but honestly, if it's true, they're going to find out anyhow. Better to make parents mad than to throw away your money. In both of the stories I have shared here, the amount of money was not a fortune, but not pocket change, either. Better to make a call and make sure the need is real and the person in need is really one of your dear ones than to give your money away to a stranger. It is possible that the caller does not immediately identify himself, but says something like, "don't you recognize me?" and when you say a name, that's who they instantly become ~ at YOUR suggestion!!

I hope you will remember these stories and share them among your friends. If it keeps even one person from falling victim to this scam, it is so worth it. And if you have \$2,500 that you don't need, I am standing at the front of the receiving line!
