Following our presentation by Mr. Barkley of the Montgomery County School Board, I had conversations with his staff questioning how we might be able to help the students in our area in a very active way. As I've discovered, there is something we can do. And it's also a project that fits neatly into the International President's theme this year of Literacy. The focus on Literacy with the Lions is now a project with a ten year span. Rather than trying to invent something new, we can partner with the school system on an existing program that needs volunteers.

This program helps second-graders with their reading The program is conducted at Cedar Grove skills. Elementary School in our service area. It is also available at other schools downcounty. There is required training to participate in the program where you will be paired up with a second grader to sit with them and read for 1/2 hour each week.

What we need to know now is if you would be interested in participating in this program. If we have at least 4 volunteers, they will come up here to train us. Training will be in August to prepare us to begin with the program when school starts in September. Otherwise, training sessions are held in Rockville.
