Board of Directors Meeting Minutes July 9, 2013

King Lion Barbara called the meeting to order at 7:02. In attendance were Lions Barbara Barry, Carol Stone, Bernie Duplan, Tessie Gladhill, Ken Phillips, Tony Barry, Mary Frances Gosnell, Joy Schwab, Patricia McKenzie, Tom Jackson, Gary Rogers, Del Mayhew, Marcia Holpuch and Chris Fletcher.

The minutes of the June meeting were reviewed and, with a noted correction of the figure for the Hyatt donations in the treasure's report to \$350, they were approved.

Lion Tony presented the financial report for the Club treasury. After discussion, the report was approved as presented. The following is a summary; a detailed report is available in the club records.

Old Business

On a follow up from last meeting, the board discussed doing a pre-school eye screening session in partnership with McDonnell's. A tentative date of September 28 was selected and flyers for publicity will be distributed around town. The effort will be coordinated with Lion Bill Mahylis for availability of the cameras and the necessary documentation.

It was noted that the July party at the Senior Center was cancelled.

Celebrate Damascus activities were discussed. Our parade position has been assigned and set-up will begin at 6:00 pm on Friday, July 13. The theme for the parade is

the "great outdoors" so members are to wear their aprons to represent a cookout. The flea market will occur Saturday from 9:00 to 4:00 with set up Thursday evening. The pancake breakfast is set for Saturday morning from 7:00 to 10:00. The secretary will email a reminder of these activities to the members.

The donation of \$200.00 to the Children's Inn at NIH has been sent.

At the last board meeting, a program called First Book was discussed. The program supplies books to needy children around the country. The board decided that our support should be kept to local programs.

Attendance at Lions Night Out with the Keys was reported to have been 26 adults and 2 kids. It was a fun night for all involved although it did rain for a short time and the Keys lost.

New Business

A new awning is needed for the ice cream barn at the fairgrounds. The cost will be \$350.00, which is \$50.00 per club that participates in the ice cream dipping. A motion was made, seconded and passed to send our contribution for the awning.

Lion Carol reported that a decision for the 5-star award would be made later and announced at the Awards Luncheon.

The first District Advisory Meeting will be held in Camp Springs on August 17th at 11:00 am.

Lion Gary briefed the board on the website and how to view the photographs of our activities that available on the site. It was suggested that either he or Lion Cindee, our webmaster, do a program on the website at a dinner meeting in the future.

King Lion Barbara adjourned the meeting at 8:25.
