The minutes of the February meeting as published in the Lions Tale were reviewed and approved as published.

Lion Tony presented the January financial report for the Club treasury. After discussion, the report was approved as presented. The following is a summary; a detailed report is available in the club records.

A letter from the American Legion Post 171 asking for support of their basket bingo that will be held on March 22. The Board voted to donate \$100.00.

The secretary reported one additional member with delinquent dues. A final letter will be mailed with a deadline of March 31 for a response.

Committee Reports

The pancake breakfast committee reported preparations would begin on Friday with set-up and food preparation.

Lion Marcia reported that 3 spaces are available at our 22-C night table. Our dream maker and guest may take two of those. An email will be sent requesting other members sign up to attend.

The club dream maker will be selected at our next dinner meeting.

Lion Cheryl reported on the preparations for youth night and the discussion centered on how to get more participation by the youth of the community. Since this Lions year is focused on literacy, it was suggested that we ask for projects that will emphasize literacy and that the projects should involve the students as much as possible.
