Ice cream dipping at the fair was a success in spite of the rain. New member Tom Ferleman dipped on Saturday with Laytonsville with his son and father, a Lion from Minnesota. Laytonsville was glad to have such good help.

Eye & vision screenings at the fair were slow on Thursday, but well-staffed.

There has been no success in finding an advisor to restore the Baker Leo club. Appropriate steps will be taken to formally dissolve the club. The new principal at Clarksburg HS will be approached to start a Leo club this year.

The Keys game outing has been rescheduled for Tuesday, August  $26^{th}$ . 25 tickets have been distributed.

Damascus Community Fair: Popcorn will be picked up next week. Volunteers are needed to staff the booth for the duration. Mary Frances will not be available on Saturday morning and will need a popcorn 'boss' designated for that time. Helpers are needed on Thursday night to help check in exhibits. Tess has lost a couple of the long-standing volunteers and will be grateful for all help. The club will be defending last year's first place prize for ice cream churning. KL Barbara will hold a taste testing of 3 flavors on Sunday, Aug. 31 at her home to include lunch. Lion Ken Phillips will again provide the hand-crank ice cream maker. Up to 8 crankers will be needed on the Friday of the fair.

No information has been received regarding the back to school backpack program from Damascus HELP.

The next dinner meeting will include a group photo, by-law vote, new member induction and Candace Whiting will be the speaker. A donation of \$250 to Special Olympics was approved to be presented to her at the meeting.
