Help will be needed on Thursday (5/14) to mark out the booth space in the gymnasium at the center. Booth set-up will be Friday and an opening ceremony will take place from 6-8pm on Friday featuring the presentation of paintings of the Damascus Community. Lions are encouraged to attend the ceremony and wear vests & hats to show a presence. The fair will be open on Saturday from 9-4 and is free to the public. Donations will be accepted. Students from Damascus High School will play musical selections during the day. Lions Mike and Wayne Marr will be calling on Lions to help. Proceeds from the fair will be shared with Faith Connections, Damascus Lions Club and Thor Teams.

Lion Joy will need an accurate head count for Youth Night on May 19<sup>th</sup>.

The amount of our donation to the DHS Post Prom party has not yet been determined.

Camping registration is going strong at the camp. The first week of Diabetes camp is already at 70% capacity and weeks 2 & 3 were at 30% as of the advisory meeting held on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of April. There are 3 rustic cabins that are in need of repairs before they can be used again. Clubs are encouraged to "claim" a cabin and make it ready for camping and hang their name over the door. These cabins need insulation and replacement doors and windows so that the air conditioning can be turned on. These cabins will add 36 more beds to the capacity of the

camp. The season opening work weekend was held on April 10 -12 and the camp is nearly ready for the campers to arrive. Good progress is being made on the installation of the new septic system. All the camper cabins and the kitchen have been hooked up to the system with only a couple more buildings left to be connected. During the weeks when camp is not in session, the camp is being rented out to local groups for seminars, meetings, weddings, etc. to generate additional revenue to keep the camp operational and "in the black."
