The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by King Lion (KL) Barbara Barry.

The minutes of the February meeting were approved. Club Treasurer Report: Approved. Foundation Treasurer Report: Approved.

Treasurer Tony noted that auction income will be essential to see us through the end of the year. Attendance at dinner meetings continues to be a concern. Letters will be mailed to all past due memberships.

A motion was passed to donate \$250 to Damascus Elementary School in support of their Read-a-thon as their youth night donation and in support of the International literacy initiative. A request was also received from the Damascus High School for \$200 in support of the Post Prom party.

Lion Joy has enlisted Kenny Sue to be the kitchen supervisor for the upcoming pancake breakfast. Volunteers are needed on all shifts for all duties. The bake table will need donations as well.

Youth Night will be May 19th at Damascus United Methodist Church.

Elections must be held at the first April meeting. A slate is being prepared for presentation at the next dinner meeting. Lion Joy does not feel healed enough to assume the duties of King Lion next year and an alternate must be found.

The District Advisory Meeting will be attended on Saturday by KL Barbara, Membership Chair Chris Fletcher and Secretary Marcia.

Lion Patricia reported that the current price for a bench is \$908 plus 230 shipping and 40 for engraving for a total of \$1,178. She will ask Gary Bellison if he would be willing to pay for $\frac{1}{2}$ the cost of a bench and the club will

buy 1.5 benches to be placed in front of Tom & Ray's. The club bench will be to honor all passed Lions.

Lion Mike reported that the Arts & Craft fair is a "go" with 35 vendors signed up so far. The recreation center fees have been waived for this event. Lions will be needed to volunteer in support of this joint effort with Faith Connections and the Thor Team. To date, Lion Mike has done all the work.

The picnic will be held at the Frederick Gladhill Brothers Museum in Frederick on Tuesday June 2^{nd} . Lion Tessie has offered her facility and we will have the opportunity to see Lion Buck's collection in a more organized fashion.

Installation Night will be on Tuesday, June 16th at the Golden Bull unless another location is secured.

A donation request was received from Hospice Caring for their spring fundraising drive.

Lion Tessie reported that the theme for Celebrate Damascus this year is "The Wonderful World of Disney" whereupon we feverishly tried to think of the names of all seven dwarfs. Perhaps we should stick with 'The Lion King.' The celebration will be held on July 10-11th and will include the parade, flea market and pancake breakfast.

The audit report was accepted and approved. Club Treasurer reported that the International dues have been paid. Both reports were accepted.

KL Barbara attended the community meeting at Baker MS last month and felt that it went well with many organizations present in support of the youth of the community.

Damascus HS awards night is May 5th and our Youth Night is scheduled for May 19th.

Zone Chair Gary Burdette will hold a new member orientation on Thurs., Feb. 19th at the Germantown Community Center at 12900 Middlebrook Road at 7pm.

Speakers for the remainder of the Lion year have been secured.

Lion Patricia was not present to report on the current price for a bench.

Lion Tom Jackson reported that the Sign Committee met in January. We got all the dates we requested, to include Blood Drives, Pancake breakfast and the golf tournament.

Lion Dale Ryan has submitted the Damascus Lions Club for the Friends of the 4-H Award to be presented on February 21st at the fairgrounds. Julie Sain will attend as the club representative.
