On Saturday morning, November 7, 2015, seven (7) members of the Damascus Lions club participated in a trash cleanup of Valley Park Drive. The Lions Club recently "Adopted" the one mile stretch of road between Ridge Road (Rte. 27) and Woodfield Road (Rte. 124) as part of the Montgomery County Adopt A Road (AAR) program. Montgomery County will be posting signs on our adopted roadway in the near future and the signs will identify the DAMASCUS LIONS CLUB as being responsible for the roadway. Part of our responsibility is to perform a road cleanup six (6) times per year, and to report to the county after each cleanup, identifying how many volunteers we had and how much trash we picked up. The AAR chair, Lion Tony, has sent the report to the county informing them that we picked up three (3) large garbage bags of trash. Board of Directors Meeting Minutes 10 Nov 2015

The meeting was called to order at 7:0 pm by King Lion (KL) Barbara Barry.

The minutes of the Sept. & Oct. meetings were approved. Club Treasurer Report: Approved. Foundation Treasurer Report: Approved.

The payment for our work at the Ice Cream Barn at the Montgomery County Fair has been received by the King Lion in the amount of approx. \$2,400. It will be presented at a regular meeting to our project Chair.

Another thank you was received by a winner of the fair. Dues continue to dribble in.

Lion Julie was finally able to make contact with Damascus Community Bank and reports that they are excited to partner with us for a community shred event in the spring. It will be held at Damascus United Methodist Church utilizing the drive-through area to keep traffic flowing well. We will hand out information on the Lions. The bank has agreed to fund the expense of the truck. A mutually agreeable date will be set for late April or early May.

In the matter of help for Gaithersburg Elementary School children needing glasses, we agreed to provide funding for 2 children.

Lion George reported that the White Cane drive results exceeded \$2,200 this year. All shifts were filled for the first time in many drives. It was one of the best drives in a long time, but not a record. We have yet to reach the \$2,300 mark.

We voted to contribute \$750 to the community Thanksgiving meal. Their attendance has been down.

Lion Mary Frances reported on the Holiday basket program as follows: She has met with the Tradesmen Motorcycle Club and seen their amazing contributions of toys for this year. The toys can no longer be stored at her home, but she has located an adequate space for them. We will be serving 30 families in the area this year consisting of 59 adults and 82 children. We will not be doing Christmas stockings, but we will continue with collections of hats, scarves, gloves, mittens and socks to include in the "baskets." An attempt has been made to contact all families already, with 19 accomplished and further follow-up needed for the remaining 11. A letter will be sent to all Lions to make a donation for the fund this year in lieu of

previous donations of goods for the stockings and shopping for the toys. Collections will still be done in town and the jar will still be passed around at the meetings for monetary contributions.

Lion Mike reported that the tax return for FY15 (ended 6/30/2015) is due on 11/15/15 and an extension will be requested. The return will be finished and reviewed at the board meeting in January.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:53pm.

Twenty-nine dedicated Damascus Lions performed storefront collections over thirty-eight two-hour shifts. Every one of those Damascus Lions is to be commended for their sacrifice. Please visualize the word "Lion" in front of every name in this article. Otherwise, in order to pay the fines I would have to cancel my cable television and go back to rabbit ears.

Special Recognitions:

- Five $\underline{Over\text{-}\$100\text{-}in\text{-}One\text{-}Shift}$ recognitions go to:
 - **Woody Ward**, who collected \$152.00 at CVS on Friday afternoon;

 - **Barbara Barry**, who collected \$107.15 at Safeway on Thursday afternoon;
 - **Julie Sain,** who collected \$103.20 also at Safeway on Thursday afternoon; and
 - Warren & Joy Schwab, who collected \$101.70 at Safeway on Thursday afternoon.
- Ten Lions worked multiple shifts (indicated with a "(2!)" or "(3!)" following their names below). Some of these "extra shifty" Lions brought in over \$100 total when you sum up all their shifts. Were it not for Lions working multiple shifts, we would have collected about \$580 less.

We will deliver food, clothes, toys and gifts to 29 families consisting of 82 children and 59 adults on Saturday, December 21. You will find a TimeLine for the project in this newsletter. I suggest you print it and put it on your family bulletin board so that you will readily know how the project is moving and when you need to provide your assistance. We will have sign-up sheets at the meeting December 1 for helping with sorting, wrapping and building a delivery team. We need 10 teams.

The Tradesmen Motorcycle Club have delivered the toys! What an outpouring of love as there are 3 bicycles, scooters, balls, dolls, trucks, games - you name it, we have it!! The toys have been sorted and are ready for each family. Lions are asked to bring mittens, hats, gloves and socks to the Holiday Party on Tuesday, December 15. We will "warm" a tree with them that evening reflecting our eagerness to keep our recipients warm. The children range from 6 months to 18 years old and we would like to have enough gloves, hats and socks to warm the adults as well.

Bob Newlin is organizing the school food drives, the NRC Food Drive, and the pickup and delivery of the items to the church on Wednesday, December 16. That evening, December 16 at 7:30, we will set up the tables and food signs and then sort the collection of food from the schools and NRC. Thursday, we need wrappers for the clothing and sorting them into their family bags. Friday, we will continue to pack the items up for Saturday delivery.

For those who signed up for a Delivery Team, your family names and information will be sent to you by email before December 12, This will give the team time to contact the family and to locate them. Teams who have signed up to deliver the food and gifts will have Thursday and Friday from 1 pm to 5 pm to pack their food for their respective families. Should a team not be available during

those hours, please let me know and we can have the Leos pack your food for you. And Lions, as you meet and greet your families to whom you are delivering, remember, Poverty it not always visible!
