DAMASCUS LIONS NEW SCHOLARSHIP

The Board of Directors voted several years back to discontinue the Student Loan Program.

The Principal paid back on these loans has been kept in a Student Loan Principal Fund and there is one student loan outstanding. During the 50 plus years of the program, the Lions had one loan that defaulted some years ago. The fund was originally started and funded by Damascus Motor Company in honor of its Comptroller Lion Basil Burdette.

Thus, the Scholarship Committee created a special Scholarship Program to recognize *Unique Achievement* for graduating seniors in the Damascus/Clarksburg Cluster. The scholarship will be in the amount of \$1,000 each and will cover expenses of books and/or necessary equipment required for continuing education. Up to three scholarships may be given in a year. The requirement is submission of a 500 word essay entitled "*My Journey*" explaining the applicant's response to a particular hardship and how that struggle has brought the student to where they are today.

Applications may be obtained for the Lions Club web site or from Mary Frances Gosnell. Applications are due by April 15 and will be presented at the Club's Youth Night and at the school's Awards Night.
