Greeting Fair Goers with Popcorn at the Fair


"Help yourself to a bag of popcorn, courtesy of the Damascus Lions Club"!

September Board Minutes

Board Meeting Minutes

9/13/2016

The meeting was called to order by King Lion Joy Schwab at 7:06. Attending were KL Joy Schwab, Lions W. Schwab, G. Hibbard, M. Holpuch, J. Washing, B. Barry, T. Jackson, P. McKenzie, D. Mayhew M. F. Gosnell, R. Molesworth, and T. Gladhill.

The minutes of the 8/9 meeting were approved, they appeared in the Sept. Lions Tale.

Treasurers' Reports

Secretary's Report

Fifty-one members have paid dues, with twenty prepaying for meals. Fifteen members have not yet paid. The membership chair, Lion Marcia, is contacting each of those members.

We received information about a potential fundraiser from Whitley's Peanut Factory in Virginia selling their peanuts. After discussion, the board decided not to pursue at this time.

A limited number of district roster books are available. Anyone interested, please contact Sec. Tom Jackson. They are free to members while supplies last.

Business items:

At the recent Advisory Board meeting, Value Village presented information on a potential fundraiser. Value Village accepts old clothes, shoes and furniture, paying a set rate per pound. The board discussed the possibility of collecting clothes and delivering them to Value Village. It was recommended that we hold a collection from the community in conjunction with the shredding event. And it was recommended that we meet with Nancy from Harwood House Thrift Shop to discuss adding their unusable clothing to our collection. Lion Del will follow up with Nancy on the Thrift Shop Steering Committee.

Lion Tess reported that the attendance and exhibits at the fair were down significantly this year. Our ice cream churning team did not place this year.

The Damascus Historical Society Museum has contacted our club about having a Lions Exhibit at the Museum. KL Joy is pursuing this. If you have ideas or material for exhibits, please let her know.

KL Joy is working on a dictionary project, which will give a dictionary to students in our Damascus Cluster. This was a Rotary Club project, but we have taken it over in Damascus. Approval must be obtained from the MCPS superintendent. Lion Joy will meet with him soon.

Lion Patsy suggested a potential fundraiser with area restaurants. Several local restaurants (e.g. Chipotle, Ledo's) will donate a percentage of their take for an evening to non-profits for every meal eaten by someone who mentions the club. Lion Patsy will follow-up.

LCOF paid for the tickets to the Montgomery County Fair used by the Lions who worked at the Mobile Health Unit on Thursday. LCOF would like the club to reimburse them for the tickets. The board approved the request. A Damascus Crafts Festival and Business Expo is being held Oct. 11 from 11am to 4pm. Our club was invited to host a table. The board decided to not pursue this at this time.

Membership Chair Lion Marcia reported that we have a new membership application form Neville Levi who is a teacher's assistant at Hallie Mills Middle School. His application was unanimously approved. He is also interested in starting a Leo club at the school.

Lion Mary Frances reported that we gave out 1700 bags of popcorn at the Community Fair. Seventeen Lions put in approximately 147 hours of service. The cost to the Lions was \$270 for supplies, with enough left over to handle next years fair.

Lion Mary Frances also reported the Holiday Basket Project would be held in the basement of the Activities Center of the DVFD this year. The Damascus UM Church was booked the week we plan to prepare and deliver them. Before the meeting, Lea Purvis, the winner of our basket drawing at the Damascus Community Fair, was presented with the basket. She is interested in learning more about the Lions. Lion Marcia invited her to attend
