Damascus Lions Scholarship Offerings

The Damascus Lions Foundation is again offering the Vernon R. Simpson Scholarship to graduating seniors residing in the Damascus/Clarksburg School Cluster. The applicant may not be a dependent of a member of the Damascus Lions. The applications are evaluated on community service, leadership potential in high school and non-school activities, character, volunteerism and work experience. The club has budgeted for 3 \$1500 scholarship to be awarded at Youth Night, May 2. The applications are due April 4.

The Damascus Lions Unique Achievement Scholarship is also being offered this year. Three scholarships of \$1000 each have been approved. The scholarship is geared toward the applicant who actively demonstrated an attempt to overcome a unique challenge during their high school years and who will attend a junior college or a technical/vocational school after high school. The scholarship will cover the expenses of books and/or necessary equipment required to continue their education. The student must reside in the Damascus/Clarksburg School Cluster. The applications are due April 7 and will be awarded at Youth Night, May 2. Applications are available on the Damascus Lions Web site or from Lion Mary Frances Gosnell.

Lion Tom passed out a listing of the 5 star requirements and the club's efforts to date and asked the board members to review it and report back with any additions or corrections.

Committee Reports

The Shred-fest Committee reported that the event will take place on April 22 at the Damascus United Methodist Church. It will not be in conjunction with White Cane this year but there will be a White Cane bucket available to take donations. The bank will again be pardnering with the club and there will be a drive to collect used clothing to be processed through Value Village for fund-raising.

The Fund-raising Committee reported an effort is being made by Lion Patricia to solicit donations from community businesses to the scholarship fund.

The Medical Equipment Committee reported that more requests are being received for outside our service area. Lion Tess tries to direct these requests to clubs in the caller's area but is not always successful. Because of possible liability and delivery issues, it was recommended that loaning equipment outside our area be minimized. Liability coverage may be provided by LCI and that issue will be investigated. Lion Tess also expressed concern about the environment of our storage area.

The 22-C Night Committee reported that our ad for the program is due. IPP Barb will rework our input and submit it. A club member was nominated and approved for recognition at 22-C night.

The Scholarship Committee reported that the budget item would remain at \$4500.00.

Old Business

The dictionary project has been cancelled. KL Joy finally was able to get through to the county board and was told that the board of education does not want the students to have the dictionaries.

New Business

KL was contacted by PDG Gary Burdette to request our help in staffing the Health Trailer at the Montgomery County Fair on Thursday of the fair. It was agreed that we could do that and the discussion lead to a discussion of daytime attendance at the fair and the low turnout at the Trailer. KL Joy will contact the fair board about getting a better location for the trailer.

Lion Mike Thornett's book reading program that is a part of youth night will be submitted as a Centennial Program to Lions International. Also a push to charter the Clarksburg High School LEO for the centennial year will be made.
