# WREATHS ACROSS AMERICA December 16- Lion Tess

The morning of December 16, 2017 was cold, brisk and sunny. My sister, niece & I had volunteered to help place the wreaths on the graves at Arlington Cemetery along with the hundreds of others. We started out on the metro at West Falls Church-near my niece's house, but we had to wait for several metro trains before we could get on one. Then we waited another 25 minutes to get into the cemetery. We also had to wait in long lines to pick up the wreaths from the wreath trucks. Finally we took the wreaths to 3 graves and left them. We went back to the trucks several times for more wreaths. At one point we found 3 wreathless graves that were actually wives of military that were laid to rest. They also have served our country in their own way. In the process we had laid some on Marylanders to honor our home state. At this point we were near the JFK burial site, as we walked up to it some of the Kennedy family arrived and had a wreath laying service. They moved to the site of RFK and then to Teddy's grave and did a small ceremony at each one.

These graves were each a little to the left of JFK and marked only with a white cross. The crowd we had been following continued on with us in tow to the USS MAINE MAST MEMORIAL, the actual mast from the USS MAINE. It was there to honor the dead from a mysterious explosion that destroyed the USS MAINE as it was docked in Havana Harbor on Feb 15, 1898 killing the sailors and marines that were on board at the time. Some of the bodies are buried here and some are buried at the Key West Florida Cemetery. After that small ceremony we moved to the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and watched the noon changing of the guard along with a wreath laying ceremony. Wreaths Across America, the sponsor of the wreath laying event, actually laid the wreath on the Tomb. Meanwhile the President's Helicopter flew past!

We then went back to my niece's house and picked up my brother-in-law and niece's husband, and made our way into DC for dinner at Old Ebbitt Grill which was very, very good. Afterwards we ventured out to look at the National Christmas Tree and other holiday lighting around town.

I would highly recommend participating in this event if you have the opportunity.

# HOLIDAY BASKETS

"Twas the day before Christmas Eve and all thru the Gladhill Showroom was a cluster of Lions, family members, friends and BSA Troop 445 waiting for the food, toys, clothes and gifts to be loaded into their sleighs. Even Santa was ready! Seems as though 8:30 – 9 o'clock was the magic time for the sleigh bells to jingle. But not before getting a bit of coffee and refreshment to carry them through their sleigh ride journey!

For the previous 8 weeks, preparation was being made to put the project in order for the deliveries. The Tradesmen Motorcycle Club had their Toy Run, the families were notified by mail that our Lions would be delivering food and gifts, Lion Chris had talked to each family verifying info, Shoppers invaded Kohl's for an outfit for each of the 52 children and towels for each family as well as gift cards for the Teens, Lion were purchasing warm winter items for the families, gifts were being wrapped while the toys were sorted, Lions were asking the community to support our project either financially or by donating fruit and toothbrushes, while the Leo Clubs and NRC were holding canned food drives and Lions were signing up to work in all capacities to make the project successful. And during that time, we spent approximately 325 hours making it happen - Not counting the Leo Clubs time, the Tradesmen time nor the Gladhill employee's time.

It took more than 60 people to make the project happen -28 Lions, 10 family member, 6 friends, 7 Boy Scouts and 10 - 12 Gladhill employees; Many working numerous days and times.

The out-of-the -pocket cost of the project was \$3,000. And to date, we have received \$2,210 in donations from Lions and merchants. Also donations were made by Butler's Orchard, Water's Orchard, Damascus Dental, Gladhill Bros., Safeway, Starbucks, The Tradesmen Motorcycle Club, and, of course, Kohl's generous 30% discount. Looking at the big picture – the project's estimated value as a \$ 11,000 plus one.

Thanks to all for giving of their time and energies to help others especially during the most busy time of the year! Much appreciation to ALL for a project with volunteers in abundance and thirty Happy Families! I continue to be honored to work with such wonderful people!
