Sight Conservation- June 18

Four cases were completed (invoices received) during June, 2018. Two were siblings. Summaries of each case follow. In all cases, I did the best I could to verify financial need and that the patient resided within our area of responsibility. There are four other current cases in process and invoices have not been received. These in-process cases could amount to FY 18-19 expenditures of \$500; give or take. Here are the four cases that completed in June 2018:

- Case 1718-12 Christian Cordova-Santos. This elementary school child was referred to the Lions Club by his school nurse.
 We paid for his vision exam and glasses from Mt. Airy Eye Care. The invoice for \$159 was forwarded to the Foundation Treasurer on June 20, 2018.
- Case 1718-13 Jennifer Cordova-Santos. This elementary school child was referred to the Lions Club by his school nurse. We paid for her vision exam and glasses from Mt. Airy Eye Care. The invoice for \$159 was forwarded to the Foundation Treasurer on June 20, 2018.
- Case 1718-19 Alayia Ellison. On May 15, 2018, I received an email from Tatyana Krivenko, school nurse at Clearspring Elementary. She was asking for help for student Alayia Ellison. I called the mother and made an arrangement between her and Mt. Airy Eye care. For a vision exam, we were billed \$50 and this bill was forwarded to the Foundation Treasurer on June 4, 2018. Alayia required the second opinion of a pediatric ophthalmologist, (a Dr. Hutchins); we are hoping that health insurance will take care of the ophthalmologist's bill. We expect another bill for glasses in FY 18-19.
- Case 1718-22 Anthony Haick. I received an email referral for Damascus student Anthony Haick from school nurse
 Tatyana Krivenko on June 7. He had a prescription and just needed glasses. I made an arrangement between Anthony's
 mom and Damascus Eyeballs. We received a bill for \$100 from Eyeballs and I forwarded it to the Foundation Treasurer
 on June 20, 2018.
