The meeting was called to order at 7:02pm by KL Chris Fletcher.

Lion Del moved to amend the minutes from the October meeting to indicate that the correct amount for the Reserve should be \$170. Then the minutes were approved as amended.

#### **Treasurers Reports:**

Financial statements were presented by their corresponding treasurers and approved with the following summary balances for the month ending October 31, 2018:

Lion Mike Thornett spoke on the audit and tax filing for the Foundation. An extension was submitted to allow time to work on outstanding issues regarding student loans. Lion Del has mailed the required postcard to the IRS for the club.

**Youth Night:** Lion Mike requested that the Youth Night program be moved to the 2<sup>nd</sup> May meeting in order to accommodate school principal's schedules to allow them to attend. There was agreement to this change and plans will proceed for the meeting to be held at Wesley Grove.

**Peace Poster:** Discussion to determine prize brackets for peace poster winners resulted in the following amounts for 1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup> place winners: \$50-30-20, making the total \$100 to the foundation. Winners were selected by paper ballot.

#### Secretary report:

• There are still 2 unpaid members for July. Collection efforts will continue.

• Thank you notes were shared and acknowledgment of a donation of \$100 for hospital equipment.

#### **Committee Reports:**

- **75**<sup>th</sup> **Anniversary**: The committee has started meeting and determined that the celebration should be held in the fall of 2021 when we complete our 75<sup>th</sup> year of service. It will be our 76<sup>th</sup> Charter Night celebration. A location is being sought with the expectation of attendance around 100. There are no cost estimates at this time, but Lion Mary Frances reported that the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration cost around \$5,000. Lion Del estimated that the fund that is currently being generated will have approximately \$4,500 by the time of the observance at the current membership level. Lion Barbara Barry moved that we transfer \$2,000 from the current cash funds to the reserve for the celebration. Motion carried. Additional fund raisers may be needed in the coming months to increase available funding.
- Holiday Giving: Lion Chris has reached all the families to get information on the children. Cards will be handed out at the next meeting to gather appropriate winter weather gear for them. There will be sign up sheets at the next dinner meeting and the detailed timeline will be published in the Lions Tale. Toys were delivered to Gladhill's by The Tradesmen Motorcycle gang. They have again gone above expectations and there are multiple bicycles and toys galore. Lion Mary Frances will again invite them to our meeting in January on the 15<sup>th</sup>.
- **Community Fair:** Collections at the fair were designated to be donated to Lions Saving Kids Sight and the total collected was \$37. Lion Mary Frances moved that the foundation supplement that amount and we send \$100 for that program. Motion approved.

• Senior Center Party: The senior center has changed the date (without checking with us) and it may have been moved to Wed., Dec. 5<sup>th</sup>. Confirmation on the date will be obtained and communicated to the club members.

### Old Business:

• There was no old business.

### New Business:

• KL Chris has become aware of a situation at Baker MS where the Home Economics teacher is buying baking supplies out of her pocket for her class. This issue was brought to her by Joann Leatherman who has asked if the Lions could help out. Discussion followed regarding how many teachers purchase classroom supplies personally and perhaps something could be done with Damascus HELP or another avenue to find a donor for the Home Ec program as we could be inundated with similar requests from virtually every classroom in our service area.
