# RELECTIONS OF THE HOLIDAY GIVING PROJECT

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

**THAT** the Damascus Lions Holiday Giving Project consumed some 400 hours of time from 30 Lions, 5 Partners-In-Service, 4 Family Members, 1 DHS Leo., 6 Troop 445 Boy Scouts and their 2 leaders, 11 friends and all the employees of an "open for business" business!

**THAT** the Damascus Lions Club served 29 families consisting of 49 children, 20 teens and 61 adults in the 20872 and 20871 zip code areas by delivering food, clothes, toys, school supplies, tooth brushes and paste, towels, hats and gloves and gift cards to teens and gift cards to families for perishable foods.

**THAT** the Leo Clubs from DHS, CHS RHMS and JTBMS along with the employees and retirees of NRC donated over 6000 nonperishable food items! 2000 plus items were donated to the Damascus HELP Food Closet!

THAT the Tradesmen Motorcycle Club members donated over 300 toys, games and crafts including 3 bicycles, 1 tryke and 2 scooters. We shared some of the toys with Toys For Tots at Gladhill's collection box for distribution in the southern Frederick county area! The minutes of the November meeting were approved.

#### **Treasurers Reports:**

Financial statements were presented by their corresponding treasurers and approved with the following summary balances for the month ending November 30, 2018:

**Secretary Report:** 2 members still outstanding from July dues payment. One due to bad address, the other has been in contact and has family crisis. Both will be billed for full year with January notice.

Holiday Baskets: 8 teams have been organized, some serving 5 families, the rest with 4 each. Gift cards for \$30 from Kohl's will be provided to youth over 12 – there are 20 teens this year. Each family will be receiving school supplies, towels and oral care items. Toys for those under 12 will be bagged for delivery. There will be no wrapping this year. A motion to exceed budget by \$500 to meet the needs of the families this year was approved. The Tradesmen Motorcycle Club again donated an excess of toys from their ride. We passed on to the Toys for Tots program those we did not use. Both Santa and the Tradesmen will be invited to our January meeting.

**Calendar updates:** Pancake breakfasts for next year will be on 3/16, 7/13 & 10/26. The dates for the Shredfest and White Cane are not yet final.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**Fundraising:** Lion Patsy noted that the Amazon Smile program has brought \$189.56 to the club so far in donations. This is before the holiday buying season. Members who make online purchases are encouraged to use this painless method of donation. We need another fund raiser and Bingo is not a bad one. Pull-offs help raise the revenue and a cash bingo seems to be popular and may be more profitable. We would need to coordinate (and not compete with) the fireworks Bingo run by the DVFD in the spring and fall as well as maintain awareness of the Legion Thursday night sessions. Sunday afternoons may be a good time, drawing an older crowd and possibly offering food and pie to aid the DVFD coffers as well. A minimum of 300 tickets need to be sold for a successful big money Bingo and those in the know admit that the sales of tickets happen primarily in the last two weeks no matter how early they are offered. Patsy to explore a date near the end of September and draft a budget. Lion Joe also mentioned that online donations can be made via our facebook page with a donation button. He will get details on how that program works and any costs that may be involved.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**Speaker donation:** Following our presentation from Mark Searles on Juvenile Diabetes, Lion Wayne won the 50/50 drawing (\$37) and asked that his winnings be donated to the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation. Lion Patsy made a motion that we add to that amount and send a total of \$100 to JDRF. Motion passed unanimously.
