She said the referral information

we gave to the parents whose children did not pass was helpful.

Secretary Report: Thank you notes were received from donations made. Of particular interest was the group that Sandy Gill spoke for who would like to donate wooden toys for our Holiday Basket program next year. A few dues remain outstanding. Collection efforts will continue. Thank you notes will be sent for medical equipment donations received.

Membership: Lion Julie presented a resignation letter from Lion Jennifer Warfield who will be leaving the area in April. Her request was approved with regret. She will be terminated as a member in good standing.

Committees:

- Pancake Breakfast: Lion Mary Frances needs more kitchen help for the breakfast. Shopping will be done on Tuesday, pre-cooking on Friday. Flyers are up around town and tickets are available for presale. 6 Leos are scheduled to attend. Donations are needed for the bake table. Cooking will start at 10am on Friday with room setup at 1pm.
- > Preschool Vision Screening: Lion Julie needs 2 more helpers for March 20 & 21st from 10-12 am.

Old Business:

- ➤ **Website:** It is back up but needs updating Lion Tammy Hertel will investigate taking over the maintenance of the site.
- ➤ **Donations:** Recurring donations were approved as follows: Special Olympics of Maryland, \$250; Friends of the Library, \$250; Damascus Heritage Society, \$250; Hospice Caring, \$200. Our last speaker, Steve Dutterer, supports the Foundation for Fighting Blindness. A motion to donate \$100 to that organization was approved.
- ➤ Combined Meetings: It was agreed that a board meeting at a dinner meeting does not work when there is a program. It just takes too long. Looking at the upcoming schedule, there is no program booked for April 2nd and that might be a good date to try the combined format again.

New Business:

- Mike Thornett: Lion Ray gave an update on Lion Mike who will be moving soon to a subacute facility closer to home. He's learning to use an electric wheelchair. He's also looking into how we can help the Thornetts, perhaps with an entrance ramp or other accommodations that need to be made to facilitate use of the wheelchair in the home. Lion Ray will let us know how we can help when the time is right. To ease his recovery and love of gardening, building various patio boxes may be another way we can help.
- ➤ Youth Night: Lion Ray is stepping in to coordinate this celebration and suggested that additional prepaid guests are charged \$17 if they pay in advance or \$20 if they pay at the door. There were no objections. It should be noted that the youth and one adult are guests of the club and payment is for additional guests sent by the organization.
- ➤ Visitation update: Lion Ray reported that we need 53 points to complete the Governor's Recognition lever and we have already surpassed the threshold for 5-star visitation requirement. We currently have 46 points and need 7 more. Visitations are scheduled for Burtonsville, Silver Spring and the Frederick Noon clubs which will complete that requirement when they have been visited.
- ➤ **District Advisory Meeting:** Scheduled for March 23, Damascus will be represented by King Lion Chris and Lions Mary Frances & Marcia. Marcia will RSVP for the club.
- ➤ **Budget Meeting:** Lion Mary Frances will host a preliminary budget meeting at her home on March 28th. Any Lion with a budget request is encouraged to submit the need to her or Lion Del in preparation for the meeting. The group will review past attendance, budgeting for program donations. Vice Presidents can help by checking with their committee chairs to see what funding needs they have.
- Summer Meetings: Lion Tessie suggested other options to the picnic, perhaps a meal at the Keys game on June 11th or an Orioles game. Exclusive use of the Keys 'party patio' is prohibitively expensive for a group our size. She will also investigate having 2 summer meetings at Montgomery United Methodist Church who expressed their willingness to do so last year.
