

- Road cleanup was done 2 weeks ago. Thanks to those who helped.
- Some of our excess medical equipment was sent to Sri Lanka to assist with care following the recent bombings. We were contacted and happy to pass on excess equipment to help others.
- We will attend a Keys game in style in June. Tess will make arrangements for the premium picnic and seats. Tickets will be \$32 each and include a buffet at 6 with the game at 7. We need a minimum of 25 for this deal. More details forthcoming.

- We will no longer run an ad in the Montgomery County Ag Fair booklet as the district has stopped bringing in the LCOF screening trailer. We will continue to dip ice cream.
- The Memorial Day Committee is looking for donations of water, sports drinks and snacks. We will not make a donation at this time.

Secretary Report:

- Our 5 star activity report for 2018-19 was submitted on April 30th. Recognition will be done at the MD22 Convention. We should qualify for the 5 star plus the Governors Special Award.
- > A note of thanks was received from the Thornetts. Mike is back home now.

Committees:

- Shredfest: We filled the dumpster at the church with used cardboard boxes. This will require an extra pickup for the church. We approved a motion to pay for the additional expense for the church and next year we will cart off our used cardboard.
- Preschool screening camera: It has been learned that the district has purchased a second camera with the plan of keeping one in the north end of the district and one in the south. Consequently, we will not purchase our own, nor will we participate in a zone purchase. The next scheduled screening is May 22nd at Montgomery UMC in conjunction with the New Market Lions Club.

Old Business:

- Budget for 2019-20: The proposed club budget was accepted. An additional change was made to the Foundation budget to include an annual donation to Damascus United Methodist Church of \$1,000 and for that donation to be made immediately and annually at the time of Shredfest in the future. The donation will be made at a church board meeting by the president. An increase in the budget amount for Leo club support to \$1,300 to include an award for the Leo of the Year and miscellaneous additional support. With these changes, the Foundation budget was approved.
- Pancakes: Approval granted to provide a gift card for \$100 to Tom & Ray's for Kenny Sue Robertson in appreciation of her support and services during our pancake breakfasts this year. In the future, Lion Julie is certified to fill that role. We are grateful for the time Kenny Sue has provided.
- Membership: We have not gotten a response from our recent prospective members. Each sponsor to reach out and see where these prospects are and if they will be joining the club. LCI has extended the \$35/new member grant to June 30th.
- District Training: KLE Patricia will attend the 1st training session and Lions Del & Marcia will attend the 2nd session. Still need to hear back from Lion Tammy to see if she will be able to attend the membership session or if an alternate should be found.
- Bus trip to Lions Camp Merrick: This trip is being run out of Leisure World to join the campers for dinner on July 10th. Limited seating is available. It's a great way to see the camp in action. Let Marcia know if you wish to attend. \$30 includes transportation and dinner. To date, the following Lions have signed up: Bobbie Warfield, Wayne Marr, Mary Frances Gosnell and Marcia Holpuch.
