Lions Eye Box

The Damascus Lions club has been collecting used eyeglasses from the community for well over 40 years and has been using these eyeglasses as an important part of its mission to assist needy people with refurbished eyeglasses.

An integral part of the eyeglass collection process is an old US Post Office box that was acquired by the club many decades ago. The Post Office box had been painted in Lions Club Yellow and Purple and had sat outside the Damascus Volunteer Fire Station for decades providing a prominent and convenient location for people to donate their used and unwanted eyeglasses.

In recent years, however, the eyeglass collection box had begun to show its age. The hinge on the deposit flap had rusted out as had the front door hinge. The floor of the box had also rusted and there were several rust holes on the front door. The box had become unusable.

The chairman of the Damascus Lions Used Eye Glass and Hearing Aid Collection, Lion Del Mayhew, approached Lion Tony Barry in March 2019 to discuss the possibility of repairing the box. Shortly after the discussion Lion Tony transported the box from the Damascus Fire Station to his workshop and began the repairs. The box was disassembled and sandblasted down to bare metal. The rust holes in the floor and door and other areas were repaired and new hinges were installed in the deposit flap and on the front door. The entire box was primed and painted using John Deere yellow and the box was accented with Lions Club Purple.

Once the repairs were made and the painting was complete, Lion Tony brought the box to Dovetail Signs, Printing and Woodworking to have the Lions decals and lettering installed on the box. Dovetail has always been a generous partner to the Damascus Lions club and they did an excellent job with the lettering. Pat Powers of Dovetail pointed out that they had done the lettering on the box the first time which they estimated was sometime in the 1980's.

Lion Tony returned the refurbished eyeglass box to its place outside the Damascus Fire station in November 2019. We all hope the box provides another 40 years of service to the Damascus Lions club and the Damascus community.

The board meeting was called to order by QL Patricia McKenzie at 6:57pm. IPP Chris Fletcher indicated that the date of the health fair in the minutes of the October meeting should reflect the date of November 7th (not the 11th) and the minutes were accepted as amended.

Treasurers Reports: The October reports for the club and foundation were submitted and approved.

Secretary: Thank you note was received from recipient of hearing aids. Lion Mary Frances worked with the recipient to get new hearing aids at a cost of \$250. Also a thank you from a Community Fair winner including a photo with her cow.

Committees:

- > Pancakes: Estimate of net proceeds of \$2,400. The date for the March breakfast has not yet been set.
- ➤ Holiday Baskets: Lion Mary Frances reports that we were given 25 families that included a total of 102 children and 70 adults. Although we had requested 35 families, this distribution exceeds our past level of support by quite a bit and we will serve these 25 families and no more. The Tradesmen Motorcycle Club held their toy drive on Saturday. Some Lions attended and they were again very generous. We will not be collecting hats, gloves and mittens this year.
- Senior Center Party: The date of the December party is now scheduled for Wed., Dec. 11th at 1pm. Lion Sue welcomes all assistance at the Senior Center (Library building).
- Peace Poster Contest: We reviewed the 13 qualified entries for the contest this year and selected our 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winners. Lion Tammy will submit our winner for District consideration.
- ➤ **Blood Drives:** 50 units of blood were collected at the last drive. This is an increase over recent drives and a good sign.
- ➤ Ice Cream Dipping: QL Patricia would like to review the contract for next year before it is signed. We would like a larger percentage of the proceeds as it is a great amount of work to maintain the building and manage the oversight during the fair. We would like to know if the coupons are included in the calculation of commissions. This was impossible to ascertain by the single club recap we were given. We would need to see the overall numbers to tell if coupon sales are included or not. Lion Tammy will voice our concerns at the next Ag Fair meeting.

Old Business:

Boy Scout Troop 445: Lion Marcia reports that we will retain the Troop 445 number for up to 2 years as allowed by the scouts. With the program now including female membership, we may reinstitute the Troop as a girl troop in the future.

New Business:

- ➤ Tree Lighting: We have been asked to participate in the Wesley Grove UMC tree lighting celebration this year. It will be held on Thursday, December 5th at 7pm at the church. We can collect eyeglasses, hearing aids and food for Damascus HELP. Lions are encouraged to attend and wear your vest.
- ➤ **Welcome Signs:** The welcome signs at the edge of town have faded to a soft pink. We should look at replacing them in the near future.
- **Preschool Vision Screening:** We will get the camera for Dec. 7th Breakfast with Santa at Gladhill's.
- ➤ **Web Site:** The web site hasn't been updated since March. We at least need access to the site to make updates if Lion Cindee is no longer able to update.
- ➤ Long Term Storage: We need a place to store club "stuff", for instance, pancake breakfast supplies, popcorn popper, white cane signage, banners, Lion costume, etc. Items are currently scattered at individual houses. Lion Mary Frances has looked into climate controlled storage in Mt. Airy that costs \$170 monthly for a 10x10 space. Does anyone have another suggestion?
- > Cub Scout Pack 438: Lion Marcia reports that Chipotle won't do a fund raiser for the scouts due to their stance on gay leadership. She has asked that the Lions do a fund raiser that the scouts will promote and direct the proceeds to the Cub Scouts to defray some of the increase in dues this year. Targeting December 7th for the date. This was approved.
