The club policy on meals is that they are to be paid in full in advance or at the door. Partial payments will not be accepted going forward except as authorized by the Board in advance or due to special circumstances. An article will be submitted for the December Lions Tale clarifying the policy for the sake of the sanity of the secretary.

Committees:

- Membership: Membership application for Lauren Holbrook was presented and approved. Our next meeting is a Prospective Member Night. In order to have time to accept and approve applications at a regular Board Meeting in time to have new members inducted at Charter Night, it was suggested that Prospective Member Night be moved to the first September meeting in the future.
- Community Fair: 2,150 bags of popcorn were distributed at the fair a record number! 17 Lions and partners and prospects turned out to assist for a total of 185 hours. Our cost for this year was \$250. \$85 was collected in cash donations which will go to our general fund. Great job by coordinator, Lion Mary Frances Gosnell. Lion Tessie reported that fair entries were up this year after several years of decline. There were 596 entries and more entries per person than last year. She thanked the Lions for their great support and help with check-in. Even with the increase in registrations, it was a smooth process. Livestock and live animal entries continue to decline. The fair banquet will be held on Thursday, October 17th and anyone who helped is welcome to attend. It will be held at the activity building at 6:30pm. Please RSVP to Lion Tessie to attend. Our ice cream churning team did not get recognized this year. It has been determined that using borrowed equipment is not the way to go. The board authorized the purchase of an ice cream churn and QL Patricia has designated Lion Tony Barry to make the selection. Payment for the equipment to come out of Community Organization Support budget. One last mention on the popcorn... after completing the application (downloaded from their web site) for the appropriate MoCo permit required to give away popcorn and having that returned by the county so a new form could be completed and submitted, Lion Mary Frances was called by the inspector to verify the time she would be available for inspection. His officialness appeared and fussed about over the location of the hand-washing station, whether or not we had gloves (we did), our hairs were covered (they were), we had appropriate cleaning products for our machine (we do), and other sundry nuisances on his check-list. Then he asked where the rest of our operation was located, to which she said, 'This is it.' He said, 'This is all?' 'Well, yes, this is everything.' Upon which he turned on his heel, harrumphed and left the fairgrounds. Since we weren't cited, I guess we passed the inspection!!
- Meetings: The next meeting topic will be the Alert Program. There is no budget for this district program so no donation will be presented.
- Remembrance: The current policy was reviewed and another category added to the guidelines to recognize the passing of a sibling with a card. Additionally, poinsettias and fruit will be given to shut-ins and widow/ers.

Old Business:

- Montgomery County Fair: The collection cans put out at the Dairy Barn were approved by the Fair in advance. Even so, some feel uncomfortable collecting donations at an event sponsored by MoCoAg. The \$900 collected during the week was sent to Lions Camp Merrick with each of the 8 participating clubs receiving credit for a \$112.50 donation. Going forward, we will recommend that each club decide if they will collect donations during dipping and should take their donations for their day and not combine the entire week together.
- Where Angels Play Foundation: This event is happening this weekend and we have been asked to help with the refreshment table. There is a request for 2 Lions for each of 2 shifts for 2 days – 8-11am and 11-2pm on Friday and Saturday. So far, only 2 have signed up.

New Business:

- Zone Meeting: There will be a Zone Meeting on Thursday, September 19th at 7pm at Montgomery College. Marcia will find out the building and room number and send a message to QL Patricia and Lion Mary Frances Gosnell who will be attending the meeting.
- Pancake Breakfast: October 26th will be here before we know it. Tickets have been sponsored by Bob Fitterer Roofing. The breakfast is the same day as the scrapbooking event at the DVFD Activities Building. We should advertise to them.
- > Holiday Baskets: It was decided that we would request 35 families to assist this year.
- Hearing Aid assistance: Lino Mary Frances has been in touch with a client working with the UMd hearing program and they qualify for hearing aids at a reduced rate of \$250. She will apply for a matching fund grant from the Garner Fund to cover half that cost.
- Preschool Screening: IPP Chris will be working on scheduling at least one preschool vision screening session each month.
