"Wassail" is the message I want to send for this time in the New Year.

For centuries, going back to Anglo-Saxon times, holiday revelers have wished each other "Wes hal!"—Be Whole!—while sharing this drink. It was traditionally enjoyed on Twelfth Night (January 5 or 6), but can certainly be used to warm the body throughout the holiday season. Wassail traditionally contained roasted apples, which would swell up and burst apart in the hot punch.

INGREDIENTS

5 to 6 large baking apples, peeled and cored

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 quarts beer or ale
- 2 cinnamon sticks or 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger /Zest of 1 lemon
- 1-1/2 cups sherry or sweet red wine

INSTRUCTIONS

Preheat oven to 400°F. Cut the apples into thick slices, and arrange in layers in a covered casserole dish, sprinkling a few teaspoons of sugar over each layer. Cover and bake for 30 minutes. (The apples will get puffy and soft.)While the apples bake, combine the beer, spices, lemon zest, and remaining sugar in a large saucepan. Heat slowly, bringing just to a simmer. (Don't let the mixture boil.) When it is hot, add the sherry and keep heating until the mixture reaches a simmer again, still not boiling. Place the hot baked apples in a punch bowl, and pour the hot wassail over them. Serve hot.

Or try the Non-alcoholic Light Wassail

Hot spiced apple cider with just the right amount of spices that both adults and kids will enjoy.

INGREDIENTS

1 gallon apple cider
2 cups cranberry juice
1/2 to 1 cup brown
sugar, to taste
2 teaspoons
cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon ground
cloves
1 orange, thinly sliced
6 small cored apples
(optional)



INSTRUCTIONS

Combine all ingredients in a large saucepan or pot, adjusting sugar to taste, and simmer for 30 minutes. Serve in mugs, or pour into a punch bowl and serve warm in cups. An option for a festive touch: Add baked apples. Core the apples, lay in a baking dish with a little water (6 tablespoons), and roast 30 to 45 minutes (until apples are softened). Then add to the punch bowl once it's ready!

In addition, I have a presentation of "Wassail" arranged by Ralph Vaughn Williams by Six Degree Singers for your listening enjoyment. HOLIDAY GIVING 2020

It has been over 20 days since the Gift Cards were mailed to each of our thirty Families with a lot of trepidation in mind! Should we or shouldn't we? With the growing Covid situation since then, I think we made a good decision. We have not received any phone calls that the families have not received their gifts while the certified return receipt cards have not all been returned. And the tracking on the USPS system has not been updated! What more can I tell you, other than USPS has experienced some serious problems this season!

We served 30 families with 76 children and 67 adults. Each family received a Safeway Gift Card from \$100 to \$150 depending on the

size of the family and a \$35 Kohl's Gift Card for each of the children. The total expense for the project is \$6,537.13.

Lion Bob Snapp has received \$ 4,220 for the Holiday Giving Fund as of this writing with more to come from the area businesses! Of that amount, the Lions contributed \$2,820 and the Tradesmen Motorcycle Club, \$1,050. A huge SHOUTOUT to our members for their response to the Holiday Giving letter! While the Holiday Giving Project 2020 was quite different than previous years, our thirty families received assistance for their Holiday celebration. As well as all of you, I look forward to Holiday Giving 2021 returning to some kind of norm!
