DAMASCUS LIONS SCHOLARHIP OFFERINGS

The Damascus Lions Foundation is again offering the Vernon R. Simpson Scholarship to graduating seniors residing in the Damascus/Clarksburg School Cluster. The applicant may not be a dependent of a member of the Damascus Lions. The applications are evaluated on community service, leadership potential in high school and non-school activities, character, volunteerism and work experience. The Board has approved for the 2021-22 Budget for 4 \$1500 scholarship to be awarded at the school's Awards Night and announced at the Lions Youth Night. The applications are due April 9.

The Damascus Lions Unique Achievement Scholarship is also being offered this year. Three scholarships of \$1000 each have been approved. The scholarship is geared toward the applicant who actively demonstrated an attempt to overcome a unique challenge during their high school years and who will attend a junior college or a technical/vocational school after high school. The scholarship will cover the expenses of books and/or necessary equipment required to continue

their education. The student must reside in the Damascus/Clarksburg School Cluster. The applications are due April 9 and will be awarded at the school's Awards Night and announced at the Lions Youth Night.

International President's Message

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you: Everyone's invited – Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.

Registration fees – The registration fee will be U\$\$50 until March 31, then U\$\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be U\$\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.

Current registrants – Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.

Elections – Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.

District 22-C Cabinet Meeting

Here are the highlights and things you should know from the District Cabinet meeting held January 23rd.

- The traditional 22-C Night celebration will not be held as scheduled on March 27th. The current plan is to have a casual afternoon celebration outdoors. The current date is June 19th with the 26th as "rain date" but everything is subject to change.
- The International Convention (LCICon) has become a virtual event this year. For a fee of \$50 (before March 31), you can "attend" an International Convention. If you've ever wanted to go, here's your chance and you'll save a bunch on airfare!
- Our Multiple District Convention which was scheduled for April 15-18 in Gettysburg will also be virtual and the date will be May 21 & 22. You can attend this convention, too!
- Parade t-shirts are again available for \$12 each (through size 3X). Lion face masks can be ordered for \$8. Let's do a group order, we can save on shipping.
- Trading pins are available for the International Convention from Lion Rodrick Harris at \$3 each.
- The Glaucoma seminar sponsored by the Leisure World Lions has been rescheduled, Feb. 17th @ 1pm.
- Lion Maxine Hooker (Leisure World) has taken the place of Arthur as 2nd VDG for the remainder of this year. Chris Wooters (Waldorf) has submitted his paperwork for the position of 2VDG for the 2021-22 Lions year.
- The USA/Canada forum will be held Sept. 9-11 in lowa this year. At present, it will be an in-person event. Registration is \$285.
- The district has collected 70,000 eyeglasses so far this year.
