

A couple of opportunities were presented at the June Board Meeting to make contributions to worthy projects that are new to us. First up was the District Childhood Cancer initiative. This is a district-wide program to provide support to families coping with a child undergoing cancer treatments. Lion Michael Shavatt spoke to the club about the program at our May 4th meeting. Our donation of \$250 will be added to those from other clubs to assist families with transportation, housing, meals, or anything they may need to help out during a most stressful time. We have made our donation in memory of Linda Snapp, daughter of Lion Bob Snapp.

Our second donation of \$250 was made to the Greater Carroll County Lions Club in support of helping to supply a young man with Type 1 diabetes who is leaving for college at the University of Delaware in the fall. They are spearheading an effort to provide him with a Diabetes Alert Dog. He has had issues with his blood sugar dropping at night while he sleeps. In spite of his continuous glucose monitor alarms, he is not waking up to take care of himself. While he's still at home, his alarm notifies his mother who wakes him, but when he's at school, he loses that home support. The dog is trained to recognize the drop and will wake him. It's a pretty amazing thing, don't you think? The initial cost of the dog is \$15-20,000 then there will be ongoing costs for food and veterinary care.
