Sight and Hearing Conservation Committee Activities of the Past Fiscal Year 2021-2022

The Damascus Lions Club expended \$855.88 over the past year to help seven financially-strapped eye care patients in the Damascus/Clarksburg area. Two of the seven vision cases were children. Our Committee budget was \$2,000.

When an individual has a vision prescription and just needs help in obtaining glasses, we assign the individual to Damascus Eyeballs in the Damascus Weiss shopping center. When an individual needs both a vision exam and eyewear, we assign the individual to Mt. Airy Eye Care in Mt. Airy. Both of these providers give special low rates for the cases they receive from our Club. Our vision cases come to our attention from: county social services organizations, the Damascus Senior Center, school health staff, vision providers, and directly from the individuals needing services.

This is a very fine offering of our Club to the financially-needy residents of Damascus and Clarksburg. We can be proud of our sight and hearing conservation service to our community. Lion Wayne Marr
