Sight and Hearing Conservation Committee - 2021-2022

The Damascus Lions Club expended \$927.00 over the past year to help nine financially-strapped eye care patients in the Damascus/Clarksburg area. Six of the nine vision cases were children. Our Committee budget was \$2,500. When an individual has a vision prescription and just needs help in obtaining glasses, we assign the individual to Damascus Eyeballs in the Damascus Weiss shopping center. When an individual needs both a vision exam<u>and</u> eyewear, we DID assign the individual to Mt. Airy Eye Care in Mt. Airy. Both of

these providers give us special low rates for the cases they receive from our Club. Our vision cases come to our attention from: county social services organizations, the Damascus Senior Center, school health staff, vision providers, and directly from individuals needing services. In June, Mt. Airy Eye Care informed me that they did not want to receive any further referrals from our Lions Club. I have engaged Montgomery Village Eye Center for those patients who require both and exams and glasses. This change actually works well for us, because this new (to us) provider has staff on hand who speak Spanish. We greatly needed a Spanish-speaking provider. In midfiscal year, our District 22C decided that it had the funds to support sight conservation expenditures on patients who reside in the 22C area, but who do not reside precisely within the realm of any particular club in the district (in our case: within Damascus or Clarksburg). This decision will be very helpful to the administration of our sight conservation program. This is a very fine offering of our Club to the financially-needy residents of Damascus and Clarksburg. We can be proud of our sight and hearing conservation service to our community. Lion Wayne Marr
