DECEMBER EVENTS

HOLIDAY GIVING PROJECT NUMBERS

SANTA'S LOADED SLEIGHS

Thirty- four (one had moved) families in the Damascus Area were visited by Santa's elves delivering Food, Clothing, Toys, Towels, Toothbrushes and Paste, Homemade Cookie and Cake Package, Apples and Gift Cards on Saturday morning, December 17 after the Teams assembled at Gladhill Tractor for coffee and buns!

Damascus Lions rallied to gather Food Drive items from schools, sort the foods, shop for clothing, pack the boxes for delivery and then delivery to the families. There were family members and friends along with the Tradesmen Motorcycle Club Members and the schools who assisted with the project as well.

It takes a community to make the project happen. The Tradesmen Members donated Toys, Games and Cash from their Toy Run enough for 2 or more to each of the 69 children. Damascus Dental donated toothbrushes for every family member. Butlers Orchard donated apples for each family as well. The three Leo Clubs and Baker Middle School held Food Drives for the project. NRC Retirees made their annual monetary donation. We are in the process of collecting donations from area businesses and friends. Lions have graciously supported Albert's Jar with donations. A BIG "Thank You" to Lion Tess and her employees at Gladhill Tractor for their assistance in supplying the space and equipment to organize and deliver the project and the assistance in moving the incoming and outgoing items to fruition.

So, what else was in the packages that the 10 teams delivered to the families? The Club, thru the Holiday Giving Fund, purchased an outfit for each of the 69 children, a \$50 Kohl's Gift Card for the 28 teenagers, two bath towels for each

of the 34 families, 34 tubes of toothpaste, 2 loaves of bread and a box of candy canes for each family. The teams handed each family \$100 to \$150 Safeway Gift Cards, depending on the size of the family.

We documented that the project had 28 Lions involved with 20 plus family and friends assisting as well as many more behind the scenes! Also, that we spent a good 350 hours with more to be added to the project. We served 160 people. The cost was \$7500. The Donations are yet to be collected and calculated. It is estimated that the project had a value of \$15,000 or more!

This is one of the DLC Foundation projects that involved most of our membership in one facet or another; Perhaps it was monetary donations and/or service time! It is a project of 76 years of service to our Damascus Community, one that has the most impact upon Lions giving of their time, energies and resources to serve! Yes, to served 160 blessed community residents! Thank you one and all!
