The Damascus Lions Holiday Basket project went off without a hitch only because you, Damascus Lions, your families, friends, employees of Gladhills and the Tradesmen Motorcycle Club worked to make it happen. All hands were on the slopes with sleighs ready to glide on Saturday morning, Dec. 23. Only

there wasn't any snow to help us glide along – but that was ok, we had our work cut out for us. Ten teams delivered food, toys, towels, clothing and more to 35 families. All was complete by 11 am. Santa was greeted by children as well as parents with big smiles and hugs. Especially the little girl with her bike – she was so excited! Santa is portrayed by Gladhill Parts Manager Gary Hilton while his wife, Barbara goes as Mrs. Santa, takes pictures and keeps him looking good.

The Tradesmen were on Board to help the teams to load, some taking their own trucks along with the team. One bag of gifts that the teams delivered were toys that the Tradesmen had donated from their Annual Toy Run. They also made a sizeable monetary donation. The Tradesmen have been participating in our project for 14 years.

We are fortunate to have Partners-in-Service, family members and friends join us in the project. Namely, Partners-in-Service Bonnie Mayhew and Jennifer Molesworth who are on our shopping team, sort and pack toys, sort and pack clothes and stuff towels etc. into the bags for each family. We also have family members Mark Molesworth, Candice and Evo, Victoria, Victor and Juliana Aghamalian and Roger Runkles, Santa's driver.

Then we have the Goldstein Family who delivers beautifully decorated packages of homemade cookies for each family. The Labor of Love by the Goldstein can be traced back to 2003 - 20 years!

Damascus Dental donates a toothbrush for each family member and Butler's Orchard donates apples for each family. Erma, who was a previous Safeway employee, donates a box of candy canes for each family while a Gladhill customer inquired about our project, he later brought in 36 boxes of cookies! And an anonymous donor brought ERtyl collectable toys to be included in the packages. And many Lions and Businesses contributed financially.

The cost of the project is \$7,000. We saved \$1.200 on clothing at Kohl's. We saved more than we spent on extra foods like peanut butter, cereal, vegetables and baking needs. We estimate the value the project to be in excess of \$15,000.!
