The scheduled blood drives for the year 2008-2009 are June 16, Sept.8, Nov. 24 and Jan. 19. The drives for March and June of '09 are not scheduled yet.

Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

Vice President Eloise Woodfield called the meeting to order at 7:10 pm. Present were Eloise Woodfield, Mary Frances Gosnell, Charlie Stone, Sue Suddath, Mike Thornett, Bill Mahylis, Martin Carr, Del Mayhew, Tucky Woodfield, Jerry Warfield, Marcia Holpuch, Roy Stanley and Ken Phillips. The minutes from the December Board Meeting were approved as published in the February Lions Tale.

The Club financial report was presented by Bill Mahylis. The report showed that the club is operating within budget with both income and expenses below projections. However, it was pointed out that since attendance at the dinner meetings has been down the cost of dinner will soon outpace income. An evaluation of dinner costs and pricing will be addressed at a future board meeting. The report was accepted as presented.

The Foundation Financial report was presented by Mike Thornett. The report showed the Foundation running with a net income of about \$2000.00 and well within budget. Most obligations have been met and with the golf tournament a remaining fund raiser, the foundation in good condition. The report was accepted as presented.

The board approved the purchase of a new club banner for displaying our award patches.

Charlie Doherty of Damascus High School outlined plans for a trip by the school band in April. It will be a 3 day trip with about 120 students traveling by bus. The cost is about \$530.00 per student and they have 7 or 8 students that cannot afford the cost. A request for financial help was made. After discussion, the board approved a donation of \$1000.00 toward the trip including the budgeted donation to the band for youth night.

The board approved a \$25.00 donation toward the annual gift to the District Governor.

For youth night, the Damascus United Methodist Church will be charging \$12.00 for the meals. After discussion, it was decided to keep the cost for members at \$10.00 but charge \$12.00 for guests.

Several donation requests were discussed and approved. Clarksburg Historical Society will receive \$100.00 for Clarksburg Days, and the Damascus Community Fair will receive \$25.00 for a prize in the coloring contest. The club will also place an ad in the fair booklet for \$100.00.

A request from the Clarksburg High School for the club to sponsor an after-prom breakfast this spring was received. They were thinking a Lions Club Pancake Breakfast. However after a discussion of how much support would be required and what facilities would be available at the Germantown Recreation Center, it was decided that the club could do a continental breakfast for the students. The cost and required support will be determined as the plans are completed. Funding for this event would come from the unplanned youth activities budget item.

A report on the Big Band Dance was given. Reservations are really lagging this year with only about 70 so far. It is estimated that the "break even" number is around 120. A decision on whether to go ahead with the event will be made soon.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40.
