Secretary's report: - It was clarified that \$8000 was loaned this year to students in the Student Loan Program. All other minutes were approved as printed in Lions Tale.

Treasurer's report: Both the Foundation and Administration accounts are in order. Approved as read.

Old business: Two new members were inducted at last meeting. Welcome Lion Matt Alsante and Lion Tony Barry.

New Business: Zone meeting on Nov. 18 at Bauer Drive Community Center. Three Damascus Lions must attend. Zone Chairman Lion Bill Duce is requesting that other clubs assist another Lions Club to help pay for eye checkups and new glasses. The consensus of the board was that we don't agree with this concept, we need more information. Damascus has already used one half (1/2) of the money we have budgeted for this year for the Damascus community.

THANKSGIVING GIVING PROJECT

In twelve (12) hours from Thurs, Nov. 20 to Sat., Nov, 22, thirty-five (35) Lions had made up and delivered Thanksgiving Food to thirty (30) Families. In that twelve hour time span, we clocked approximately 190 man hours to get the project done. And all of this was done when Ole Man Winter decided to blow some flurries our way and then to give us some frigid temps. Delivery Day was sunny and that was in line with what our delivery was all about!

The Food Drives from Rocky Hill Middle School and Damascus High School were managed by Lion Bob Newlin. Lion Bob reports that the collections were not as heavy as they have been in the past. The drives were used for Thanksgiving with the surplus stored for the Christmas deliveries.

The sorting and packing went well as the schools had sorted a lot of canned foods before packing. The food boxes donated by Peg Stone contained peas, string beans, corn, other beans, sweet potatoes, sauerkraut, cranberry sauce, soups, pasta, fresh apples donated by Rock Hill Orchard, Martins dinner rolls, 2 loaves of bread, potatoes, celery, onions, Homemade pumpkin bread by the Goldsteins, pumpkin, pie crust and a turkey.

The ten teams, of 2 -3 Lions each, showed up ahead of schedule on Saturday, They were eager to get loaded and get on their way but not before partaking of a tailgate breakfast. By 9 AM, we were cleaned up and closing the Thanksgiving project for this year. Record time, I do believe!

The cost of the project is right at \$1,000.

Lions, you have made another mark on the Damascus Community in that 30 families had a turkey dinner for Thanksgiving.

Thank you for stepping up and saying, I want to be a part of this project!

We had our 5th blood drive on Monday November 24, 2008 of the 08-09 year. The blood drive was held at the Damascus Volunteer Fire Department Activity Building between 1:00 to 7:00. We collected 87 units of blood, bringing our total so far this year to 342. The American Red Cross collected double reds at this drive.

We continue to feed the ARC staff with KFC. Its numbers can be between 15 to 20 workers. This has seemed to make a very big difference. They first are very appreciative and they stay in the building and do not go out for food. This makes the ARC staff a better work force.

We had our Mary Kay basket donated by Lion Marsha Holpuch. The value was somewhere around \$85 dollars. Thank You. We had aprons to pass out from Paula Dean and we also continued our theme of the holiday drive with gift certificates from Kohl's and Home Depot.

These cards were raffled off to our blood donors 2 women won the Kohl's and 2 men won the Home Depot gift cards. I would like to thank Safeway for always supplying the donuts. I would like to thank all the Lions Club members for all of the hard work that they do with the calls to prospective donors, set up in the morning and working the drive in the afternoon. We still have several donors that continue to give a unit of blood each time, Thank you.
