# **Board of Directors Meeting Minutes** 1/8/2008

King Lion Gary Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. Present were Gary Rogers, Eloise Woodfield, Mary Frances Gosnell, Charlie Stone, Sue Suddath, Bill Mahylis, Martin Carr, Del Mayhew, Tucky Woodfield,, Dale Ryan, Marcia Holpuch, Joy Schwab, George Hibbard and Ken Phillips.

The minutes from the December Board Meeting were read, reviewed and approved as read.

Bill Mahylis presented the Club Treasurer report. After some discussion the report was accepted as presented. As in past reports, income continues to run slightly behind budget but expenditures are also behind budget with a net of \$ 1830.00 for the year to date.

Mike Thornett presented the report for the Foundation. Both Income and Expenses were reported to be within budget. The report was accepted as presented.

George Hibbard presented the results of the Audit Committee's review of the Club and Foundation Financial status as of the end of 2007. The committee concluded that the year-end data fairly and accurately represented the assets and financial activities and transactions during 2007. The reports were accepted as presented to the board. A copy of the reports can be made available to any member who would like to review it.

The board voted to remove three members from the club roles. George Bolling was transferred to the Thurmont Club. Ira Kogod has moved out of the area with no forwarding address and was removed. Roy Flowers emailed his resignation and was removed.

Under old business, the donation to Damascus High Music Department was again tabled because Lion Charlie Holpuch was not available to speak to the board about the planned trip and the fund raising efforts that are ongoing.

Joy Schwab reported that she is still working on the details for the establishment of a Hyatt Award.

Under new business, King Lion Gary recommended that members consider attending the Leadership Training at Emmitsburg in February.

Reminders for upcoming events were given. On February 28<sup>th</sup>, there will be a Region Social in

Clarksburg. The Big Band Dance is scheduled for the 19<sup>th</sup> of April and will be on the same night as 22-C Night. On May 3-4, the Club will again participate in the Relay for Life event.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:50.

# **Community Sign Committee Report**

The Community Sign Committee meeting was held Saturday, Jan. 26. At that meeting plans were made to refurbish the sighs (the display area has seriously deteriorated) and the 2008 allotment of signage weeks was made to the member clubs.

We Lions have 11 weeks: Jan. 13–19 (blood drive); Feb. 24–Mar. 1 (spring pancake breakfast); Mar. 16–22 (blood drive); Apr. 6–12 (White Canes); Jun 1 – 21 [3 weeks] (Golf tournament and blood drive); Sept. 7–13 (blood drive); Oct. 12–18 ( if need for the fall pancake breakfast); Oct. 26 – Nov. 1 (if needed for the pancake breakfast); and Nov. 16–22 (blood drive). I was unsure when the fall pancake breakfast will be held.

Okay, even if you did not answer the first three questions correctly, you still have one more chance to show your true abilities. Here it is:

4. There is a river you must cross but it is used by crocodiles, and you do not have a boat. How do you manage it?

Correct Answer: You jump into the river and swim across. Have you not been listening? All the crocodiles are attending the Animal Meeting. This question tests whether you learn quickly from your mistakes.
