Board of Directors Meeting Minutes 6/24/2008

King Lion Gary Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. Present were Gary Rogers, Eloise Woodfield, Mary Frances Gosnell, Bill Mahylis, Martin Carr, Del Mayhew, Tucky Woodfield, Jerry Warfield, Marcia Holpuch, Ray Molesworth and Ken Phillips.

The minutes from the May Board Meeting were approved as published in the Lions Tale.

Bill Mahylis presented the Club Treasurer report. After some discussion the report was accepted as presented. Income was slightly higher than budget and expenditures are behind budget with a net of \$1470.52 for the year to date.

Bill Mahylis presented the Foundation financial report for Mike Thornett. With most of the financial activity of the foundation complete for the year, income is about \$10,000 over budget. However, most of that amount is from balance of student loans paid in December.

Expenses are shown to be about \$2000 below budget. The report was accepted as presented.

The budget committee presented the club budget for the Lion Year of 2008-2009. The budget was based on projects of expenses to the end of June. After some discussion, Lion Marcia Holpuch made a motion to add a line item "Convention Stipend" of \$1000.00 to offset some expenses for delegates with payment to each delegate not to exceed \$100.00. The motion passed. A committee will define the procedures and conditions for this distribution later. There was also a motion made to pay for the meals for officers that attend required meetings at the District level. An addition of \$300.00 to the budget was proposed. This motion passed. With these changes the budget was agreed to and shows a deficit of \$3255.00, which is similar to previous budgets.

The budget committee then submitted the proposed budget for the Foundation for the Lion Year of 2008-2009. This budget was based on the foundation performance this year with some adjustments for known changes in the student loan line item. Lion Del Mayhew made a motion to increase the donation to LCOF to \$2000.00 to be more in line with other clubs in the district. This motion passed with 1 dissenting vote. The projected income is \$24,700 and the projected expenses are \$31,200 creating a deficit of \$6500, which will draw down the surplus from the past years. With this change, the budget was approved.

Under Old Business, Celebrate Damascus was discussed. It has been proposed that the area off of Mt. Vernon Ave be used as parking for those wanting to visit the flea market and car show at Damascus Motors and there will be a need for volunteers to insure that parking is done in an orderly fashion. Lion Ray is going the contact the scout troops to see if they can help with this.

Under New Business, the board approved 2 student loans, each for \$2000.00. One will go to Kevin Wyne and the other to Alexander Mahylis.

Lion Mary Frances presented information on a 52 year old Damascus resident, who is legally blind and is looking for help in purchasing a large screen computer monitor so he can continue using his computer. It was decided that some additional information is needed before the board can consider this. Mary Frances will forward the information she has to the board members, do a follow up and possibly invite him to attend a board meeting to present his request.

In closing of the meeting, Lion Marcia, speaking for the entire board, thanked King Lion Gary for his leadership and hard work this year. His theme was to "have fun" and he delivered on that with entertaining meetings and special attractions. Thanks KLG.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:40.
