Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

King Lion Gary Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:11 pm. Present were Gary Rogers, Eloise Woodfield, Mary Frances Gosnell, Charlie Stone, Ken Phillips, Mike Thornett, Warren Schwab, Joy Schwab, Del Mayhew, Tucky Woodfield, Jerry Warfield, Dale Ryan, and Marcia Holpuch.

The minutes from the September Board Meeting were reviewed and approved as published in the October Lions Tale.

Club Treasurer Bill Mahylis presented the Club financial report. The report showed the club income and expenses to be within budget to date. The report was accepted as presented.

Foundation Treasurer Mike Thornett presented the Foundation Financial report. The report showed income to be below budget to date; however, most fundraisers have not occurred and the deficit is expected. With the additional student loan approved by the board last month, the overall budget shows a deficit to date. It is expected that this deficit will be covered as more income is generated as the year goes on. The report was accepted as presented.

During the financial report, Mike reported that he was working with the Montgomery County Volunteer Center to have the club listed as a non-profit organization that can approve student service hours. This will simplify the process for the students that help in our activities.

Our donation to the Honors Band of \$350.00 and our budgeted support for Camp Merrick of \$600.00 will be sent this month. Camp Merrick has some immediate needs and our early support will be much appreciated.

The road clean up and Pancake Breakfast are coming up soon. Plans are well underway for both and both will need support of our membership.

The board approved a \$150.00 donation to support a Damascus High School student who will be attending a festival in Peru that is sponsored by a Lions Club there. She will attend a club meeting in November to report on her trip and experiences.

Lion Mary Frances reported on the final count for Basket Bingo. The club supported the event with approximately 250 hours preparing, organizing and conducting the activity. Bingo night earned \$6802.57 for the foundation. Well over budget for the event. Holiday Baskets are fast approaching. We have signed up for 30 families and work will be starting soon for that. We will be doing both Thanksgiving and Christmas again this year. Next dinner meeting will be the kickoff for these activities.

The Hearing Loss Association of America is sponsoring a "Walk4Hearing" for the National Capitol Area at Damascus Regional Park on October 28 at 9:00 AM. Lion Mary Frances is organizing a team from the Frederick Chapter of HLAA and challenged the club to do the same. Lion Marcia Holpuch volunteered to be the captain of the club team and will recruit walkers and support from the club. A goal of \$500.00 was set.
