It was a nice warm, sunny day on Oct. 26th for the National Capital Area Walk4Hearing at the Damascus Regional Park. Approximately 130 walkers and volunteers

enjoyed the nice Autumn Day through Magruder Valley. There were 16 teams in the Walk collecting \$34,326 as of this writing. Our goal was \$50,000. Again, I think we are seeing a sign of the times! Nationwide, the Walk4Hearing walks have raised over \$700,000.

My team, 1Way4Gran2Hear, collected \$500. My sincere thank you goes to all the Lions who made a contribution to the Walk for my team and the Frederick Chapter of Hearing Loss Association of America and for King Lion Eloise and Tuck Woodfield for taking time to come and participate. Half of the amount the three teams from the Frederick Chapter raised will be returned to our Chapter to use for hearing loss education, hearing support groups and to increase awareness about the causes and consequences of hearing loss.



Everyone is welcome to attend HLAA meetings whether hearing impaired or not. We will need to become more aware of people with hearing loss, how to handle it for ourselves and our friends and what to do about it - as going forward the Baby Boomers will experience hearing loss more that any other generation.
